No. 3 at the north-west corner of Survey No. 301/2 of Neechippulli desam.
 East.—Thence the boundary runs along the western boundary of Survey No. 301/2 of Neechippulli desam to cairn No. 8 situated at the south-west corner of that field, thence along the southern boundary of the same field to cairn No. 10 at the south-east corner of that field; thence along the west sides of Survey Nos. 303, 302 and part of north side of Survey No. 300 as far as cairn No. 18 situated at the north side of the last mentioned field.

 East.—Thence the boundary runs in a south-western direction along the boundary line between Padamati-Nayudupalem and Chimakurthy hill to the trijunction stone of Padamati-Nayudupalem (zamin), Chimakurthy hill and Chimakurthy village; thence a straight line due south to the southernmost corner of S. No. 717; thence the western sides of S. Nos. 717, 716, 710, 709, 681, named field; thence a straight line to the north-west corner of S. Nos. 717, 716, 710, 709, 681, named field; thence a straight line to the north-west corner of S. No. 643; thence along the western sides of fields Nos. 642 and 631 up to the south-west corner of the last number.
 South.—Thence the boundary runs in a straight line in a south-westerly direction passing through S. Nos. 630, 628, and western sides of S. No. 594 to the north-east corner of S. No. 585; thence along the northern side of S. No. 585 up to its north-west corner, i.e., the trijunction stone of Chimakurthy village, Rajupalem (shrotriyem) and the Chimakurthy hill.
 West.—Thence the boundary runs along the northern boundary of Rajupalem (shrotriyem) up to its trijunction with Devarapalem (zamin) and the Chimakurthy hill near the Nallacheruva tank, the starting point.
