No. 332.—His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to declare, under the provisions of section 16 of the Madras Forest Act (V of 1882), that, from the 1st September 1900, the area, the boundaries of which are set forth in the schedule appended to this notification, shall be constituted a "reserved forest."
