

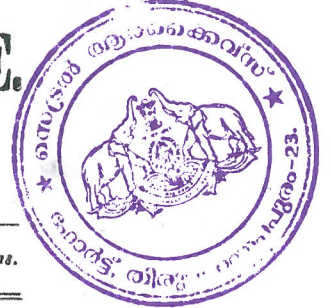

22. Tada	.. The area included within the jurisdiction of the Deputy Tahsildar Sub-Magistrates of Venkatagiri and Sulurpet, in the Nellore district.

No. 314.—His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to declare under the provisions of section 15 of the Madras Forest Act V of 1882, that, from the 1st September 1912, the areas, the boundaries of which are set forth in the schedule appended to this notification, shall be constituted "reserved forests."

Walavanad	Attappadi	Attappadi valley, Block V	<p><i>North.</i>—Starting from a point on the right bank of the Bhavani river where it crosses the Nilgiris district boundary, that boundary in an easterly direction for about 364 chains to Vellakotta peaks.</p> <p><i>East.</i>—Thence along the ridges to Tampattakallu at the north-east corner of Attappadi valley, Block II (reserved forest); thence the north, west and south sides of that reserve to its south-east corner; thence a straight line south east for about 53 chains to a point on the stream, nearly due north of Pullankotti malai; thence a straight line to the top of Pulankotti malai; thence a straight line south by east to Kattaitadu; thence a straight line south-west to Oosikallu; thence a straight line nearly due west to the top of Parambai malai; thence a straight line north-west to Adamudi on the eastern boundary of Attappadi Block III (reserved forest); thence the east, north-west and south boundaries of that reserved forest to its south-east corner on Tayikkara malai; thence a straight line to the top of Malleswaran mudi at the north-east corner of Attappadi Block IV (reserved forest); thence the north, west and south boundaries of that reserve to its south-east corner on the Yellakarainadi (stream); thence that stream to its junction with the Bhavani river; thence a straight line due south across the Bhavani river to a point on its right bank.</p> <p><i>South.</i>—Thence the right bank of the Bhavani river in a south-westerly direction for about 182 chains.</p> <p><i>West.</i>—Thence the right bank of the Bhavani river in a northerly direction to the starting point of the northern boundary.</p>
	Walavanad	Attappadi	Attappadi valley, Block VI	<p><i>North.</i>—Starting from a cairn on the top of Periya Amanthan malai, a straight line north-east for about 170 chains to a cairn on the top of Para malai; thence a straight line south-east for about 155 chains to the top of Sulla malai; thence a straight line north-east for about 150 chains to a cairn in a straight line between the top of the top of Tumbi malai and Tumbi malai; thence a straight line east south-east for about 90 chains to a cairn on the top of Tumbi malai on the Coimbatore district boundary.</p> <p><i>East.</i>—Thence the Coimbatore district boundary in a southerly direction to the top of Periyakunjara malai.</p> <p><i>South.</i>—Thence the watershed in a north-westerly direction over the top of Ellival malai and Iyyappa mudi to Padiyamugam malai.</p> <p><i>West.</i>—Thence the watershed in a northerly direction to the starting point.</p>
