Brief description.—Barren rocky blocks.

Reasons for disafforestation.—The disafforestation of the reserves is in accordance with the Forest Committee's recommendation of abandoning useless and comparatively unprofitable reserves.

No. 59.—His Excellency the Governor in Council declares under the provisions of section 16 of the Madras Forest Act of 1882 that the area, the boundaries of which are set forth in the schedule below shall be constituted "Reserved Forest" under the Act with effect from 15th November 1918.

REMARKS.—I. The following public rights of way will be admitted through the reserve:—They are open to the public and cattle under control.

(1) A path of a uniform width of 10 yards beginning at the trijunction stone of S. Nos. 147 150 and 167 and running round the edge of the reserve back to this trijunction stone.

(2) A path of a uniform width of 10 yards from the northern tip of S. No. 166 to a rough water channel which begins some five chains north of the tip and thence along the line of this channel to the southern extremity of S. No. 168.

II. The existing water channel running from the reserve to the adjoining lands and the channels which feed it will not be disturbed.

LEAVE.

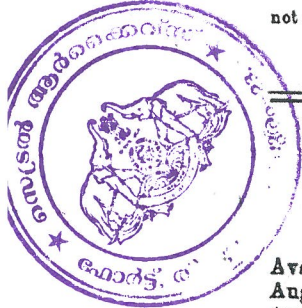
