NOTIFICATIONS.

Fort St. George, January 31, 1918.

No. 60.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 32 (a) of the Madras Survey and Boundaries Act, 1897, His Excellency the Governor in Council directs that the following shall be substituted for rules 6 and 7 of the rules framed under section 21 (ii) of the said Act and published on pages 525-526 of Part I of the *Fort St. George Gazette*, dated 7th April 1914:—

“6. The cost of renewing a missing stone under rule 5 shall comprise the following items:—

(1) The actual cost, as determined by the Revenue Divisional Officer, at the village of a stone of the required size and description which cost shall be calculated from time to time according to contractor's terms and local conditions at a uniform rate for villages similarly circumstanced.

(2) A fixed charge for the time and labour of the Government staff, which charge shall be calculated at 8 annas for each stone renewed.

(3) The actual cost of hired labour in cases where the Government Revenue Inspector or other officer deputed to carry out the work finds it necessary to supplement the Government staff by the employment of hired labour.

7. The cost of repairing a stone under rule 5 shall be fixed at 8 annas; the actual cost of the hired labour employed, if any, shall be recovered separately.”

No. 61.—His Excellency the Governor in Council declares, under the provisions of section 16 of the Madras Forest Act of 1882, that the area the boundaries of which are set forth in the schedule below shall be constituted 'reserved forest' with effect from 1st April 1918:—

REMARKS.

The following public right of way will be admitted through the reserve path ten yards wide open to men and cattle:—Starting from the north-west corner of the addition the path runs along its northern boundary to its north-east corner; thence the path runs south-west through the addition for about five chains till it meets the rock on the eastern boundary of the addition; thence it runs along the said eastern boundary crossing a thodu to the southern corner of the addition.
