quarter furlongs, the boundary continues along that side of the road, the same distance from the centre thereof towards Jalsur for about three and a half furlongs to cairn No. 62-A placed at a distance of fifty yards west of Budan Siba's darkhast; thence passing along the western, southern, and eastern sides of that darkhast south one hundred yards to cairn No. 62-B, east one hundred and eighty yards to cairn No. 62-C and north one hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 62-D on the south side of the road above mentioned; thence along that side of the road eastward for about three-fourth furlong to cairn No. 62(E) fifty yards west of Pundaraka Bhatta's darkhast; thence passing along the western, southern and eastern sides of that darkhast, south by west half a furlong to cairn No. 62-F, east by south about one furlong to cairn No. 62-G and north by east half a furlong to cairn No. 62-H on the south side of the road above mentioned; thence that side of the road eastward for about two hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 63 opposite the thirteen miles and five furlongs stone about half a furlong west of Balanadka cultivation (mulu warg No. 1 of Karadka village); thence excluding that cultivation south-east one and a half furlongs to cairn No. 64, east-south-east three hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 65, north north-west three hundred yards to cairn No. 66 and north-east two hundred and seventy yards to cairn No. 67 on the south side of the road; thence along the same side of the road towards Jalsur up to fifteen miles and three hundred yards to cairn No. 68; thence excluding mulu warg No. 27 and 72 of Adur and 57 of Karadka villages and the darkhasts of Mamunhi alias Hamudkumhi and Abbase, south-south-west five hundred yards to cairn No. 69, east-north-east three hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 69-A, east-south-east two hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 69-B, south thirty yards to cairn No. 69 (C), south-east one hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 69-D, north-east one hundred and eighty yards to cairn No. 69 E, north-west sixty-five yards to cairn No. 69-F, south-west one hundred and fifteen yards to cairn No. 69 G, north-west two hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 69-H; thence north-east two hundred and forty-five yards and two hundred and seventy yards to cairn Nos. 70 and 71 respectively; thence north one hundred and eighty yards to cairn No. 72, west by north four hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 72-A, north two hundred and ninety yards to cairn No. 72-B and west one hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 73 on the right side of the Local Fund road above-mentioned; thence the same side of the road towards Jalsur up to the sixteen miles and five furlongs stone thereon, (cairn No. 74.)

East.—Then passing round Beerae-Kochi darkhast No. 26 of Adur village) south-west one furlong to cairn No. 75 and east two hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 76; thence south for about seven hundred and sixty-six yards to cairn No. 77; and south-south-east one furlong to cairn No. 78 overlooking the north-western corner of mulu warg No. 22 of Adur village; thence south four hundred yards to cairn No. 79 on the Panchapallagudde (hill); thence south-east two hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 80 on the right bank of the Payashwani river; thence that bank of the river for a little over half a furlong to cairn No. 80-A on the north side of mulu warg No. 56 of Adur; thence passing along the northern, western and southern sides of that land, west by south one hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 80-B south by east sixty yards to cairn No. 80-C and east one hundred and seventy yards to cairn No. 80-D on the same bank of the river; thence that bank of the river southwards and westwards for about one and quarter miles to cairn No. 81 to the east of darkhast No. 29 of Adur village; thence passing along the eastern and part of the northern sides of that darkhast, north by west two hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 82 and west by south two hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 83; thence passing along the eastern, northern, and western sides of darkhast No. 32 of Adur and 27 of Karadka villages, north by west two hundred and ninety yards to cairn No. 84, north by east two hundred and forty yards and three hundred and twenty yards to cairn Nos. 85 and 86, respectively; thence north three hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 87 and on in the same direction two hundred and forty yards to cairn No. 88 on Kallakutty Adka; thence west-north-west one hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 89, south-west two hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 90, south-west by south the same distance to cairn No. 90-A, south-east one hundred and twenty-five yards to cairn No. 91, south-west one hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 91-A, again south-east eighty yards to cairn No. 92 and south-south-west five hundred yards to cairn No. 93 on Natokalla Gudde overlooking Charavod cultivations mulu warg No. 19 of Karadka village; thence passing along the north side of that cultivation and the northern, western and southern sides of Kayambadi, mulu warg No. 17 of the same village, west by north two hundred and seventy yards to cairn No. 94 on Marakodutte and on in the same direction five hundred and seventy-five yards to cairn No. 95; thence south-west one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 95-A; south by east half a furlong to cairn No. 96 and east-south-east four hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 97 overlooking the north-western corner of Puno darkhast (mulu warg No. 27 of Karadka village); thence passing along the western, southern and eastern sides of that warg, south by east four hundred yards to cairn No. 98, south by west two furlongs to cairn No. 98-A, east-south-east one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 98-B, and north-north-east four hundred and seventy yards to cairn No. 99; thence passing along the western and southern sides of Adkatotty cultivation (mulu warg No. 1 of Padikasha village), south by east two furlongs to cairn No. 100, south-east two hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 100-A and east by south two hundred and seventy yards to cairn No. 101 on the right bank of the Payashwani river; thence that bank of the river southward for about two and a-half furlongs to cairn No. 102, one hundred yards north of Arvanadka cultivation, mulu warg No. 24 of Karadka village; thence excluding that cultivation with kumaki west-north-west one furlong to cairn No. 103, south-west one hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 104, south-east one hundred and eighty yards to cairn No. 105; south-south-east two hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 106 and east-south-east one hundred and forty yards to cairn No. 107 on the right bank of the same river; thence skirting the land known as "Chittonic" west by south for seventy yards to cairn No. 107-A; thence south by east for one hundred and eighty yards to cairn No. 107-B; thence east by south for 60 yards to cairn No. 107-C on the right bank of the Payashwani river; thence that bank of the river south-westward for a little over one mile to cairn No. 108 to the north-east of Parunihatte Amboo's darkhast, No. 64 of Karadka village.

South.—Thence excluding that darkhast and Nayangaya (mulu warg No. 42 of Mulliar) north-west fifty-five yards to cairn No. 108-A, north-east the same distance to cairn No. 108-B, again north-west the same distance to cairn No. 108-C, south-west the same distance to cairn No. 108-D, north-west eighty yards to cairn No. 109, west-north-west one hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 110, south-west one hundred and fifty yards and three hundred and fifty yards to cairn Nos. 111 and 112, respectively, and east by south four hundred and sixty-five yards to cairn No. 113 on the right bank of the river above-named; thence again that bank of the river south-westward for about two furlongs to cairn No. 114, one hundred yards north-east of Kundukochi cultivation (mulu wargs Nos. 51 and 55 of Mulliar village); thence excluding that cultivation and Bombakal darkhast, No. 133 of Mulliar village, west-north-west two furlongs to cairn No. 115, north-west two hundred and thirty-five yards to cairn No. 116, south-south-west four hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 117, east-south-east three hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 118, south one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 119 and south-east two hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 120 on the right bank of the same river; thence that bank of the river south-westward for about a quarter of a mile to cairn No. 1 within one hundred yards of darkhast No. 60 of Mulliar, village.

thence passing up the east side of that darkhast north-north-east one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 3-A, west-south-west one hundred and five yards to cairn No. 4 and north-west one hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 5 on Butiadka; thence passing up the east side of Palikal cultivation (muli warg No. 2 of Mulliar village), north by west three hundred yards to cairn No. 6 on Tenkumotte, north-north-east two hundred and seventy yards to cairn No. 7 on Badigumotte and on in the same direction one hundred and forty yards to cairn No. 8 on Karkikalumotte overlooking darkhast No. 61 of Mulliar village from the south; thence passing round the eastern, northern, and western sides of Kayamula, muli wargs Nos. 50 and 139 and Meyinakaya tota, darkhast No. 137 of Mulliar village, north two hundred and seventy-five yards to cairn No. 14, north-north-east one hundred and sixty-five yards to cairn No. 15, north-north-west one hundred and eighty yards to cairn No. 16 on Doremotte, north two hundred and seventy-five yards to cairn No. 17, west by south the same distance to cairn No. 18, south two furlongs to cairn No. 19 on Kunnapuramotte, south by east one hundred and sixty-five yards to cairn No. 20 and south-south-west one furlong to cairn No. 21 overlooking Mudambudu cultivation mentioned above from the north-west; thence along the north side of Kanathur cultivation, (muli warg No. 2 of Mulliar village, west by south two hundred yards to cairn No. 22 and west north-west two furlongs to cairn No. 23 overlooking Payela cultivation, muli warg No. 2 of the same village; thence north-west one hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 24 on Pallanjammotte; thence passing round the eastern, northern and western sides of Tairin cultivation (muli warg No. 11 of Mulliar village), north-north-east five hundred yards to cairn No. 26 on Chandrapare (rock), west-north-west two hundred and thirty-five yards to cairn No. 26, south-west two furlongs to cairn No. 27 on Chemedkamotte and south one furlong to cairn No. 28 on Votikad hill overlooking Payela cultivation above-mentioned from the north; thence along the north and west sides of that cultivation, south-west one hundred and sixty-five yards to cairn No. 29 on Chaketakalimotte, west-south-west one hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 30 and south-south-east two hundred and twenty yards and one hundred and thirty-five yards to cairns Nos. 31 and 32, respectively, the last mentioned cairn being on Kuravankallu overlooking Peradka cultivation, muli warg No. 1 and darkhast No. 67 of Mulliar village; thence passing along the north side of that cultivation and of Keumamulabalapu, geul warg No. 2 of the same village, west-north-west one hundred and eighty yards to cairn No. 33, north-west three hundred yards and three hundred and twenty-five yards to cairns Nos. 34 and 35, respectively, the last mentioned cairn overlooking Votekal cultivation, muli warg No. 9 of Mulliar village; thence passing along the east side of that cultivation and of Kuckoli of the same warg, north-north-west two hundred and eighty-five yards to cairn No. 36 on Chopala hill, north-west, one furlong to cairn No. 37 on the Kumri of the same name; then north one hundred and seventy yards to cairn No. 38 and north-east one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 39 overlooking Salibail cultivation, muli warg No. 3 of Mulliar village from the south; thence along the south side of that cultivation east-north-east two hundred and thirty-five yards and one hundred and ninety yards to cairns Nos. 40 and 41, respectively, the last mentioned cairn overlooking Palthakochi, muli warg No. 3 of the same village; thence south-east one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 42 overlooking the northernmost survey stone of muli warg No. 115 of Mulliar village; thence passing along the north-west, south-west and south-eastern sides of that warg, south-west three hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 42-A, south-south-east one hundred yards to cairn No. 42-B, north-east three hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 42-C, and east-north-east one hundred yards to cairn No. 43; thence passing up the eastern side of muli warg No. 3 of Mulliar village comprising Palthakochi, Yerinjikhila, Kundathana, Totadamule and Mardamule cultivations, north one hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 44, north-north-west one hundred and sixty-five yards to cairn No. 45 on Athikal motte, north-east one hundred and seventy yards to cairn No. 46, east by south three hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 47, north by east one hundred and eighty-five yards to cairn No. 48, east one hundred yards to cairn No. 48-A, north-east one hundred and seventy-five yards to cairn No. 49, north-north-east two hundred yards to cairn No. 50, north-west one furlong to cairn No. 51 on Komali hill and north-north-west two hundred and forty yards to cairn No. 52 overlooking Chandanagai cultivation, muli warg No. 8 of Karadka village; thence passing along the eastern, northern and western sides of that cultivation east-north-east one hundred and ten yards and one hundred and twenty-five yards to cairns Nos. 53 and 54, respectively, north by east two hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 55, north-north-east one furlong to cairn No. 56, west by north two hundred and seventy-five yards to cairn No. 57, south one hundred and seventy-five yards to cairn No. 58, south-south-west the same distance to cairn No. 59 and south-west three hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 60 on Chemangala hill overlooking Cheramala hill cultivation of the above said warg; thence passing along the east side of Mangala cultivation of the same warg and Kolathangal, muli warg No. 1 of the same village, north-west two furlongs to cairn No. 61 on Mangala hill and north a little over three furlongs to the starting point.</p>

REMARKS.—A. The following cultivations will form enclosures within the reserve, being themselves free from reservation:—

- I. Kundadka cultivation, muli warg No. 47 of Karadka village, demarcated by four cairns, Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4. Area 19-80 acres. Access thereto will be by P.R.W. No. XIII below.
- II. Dodda Voyakoli, muli warg No. 45 of Karadka village, demarcated by four cairns, Nos. 5, 6, 7 and 8. Area 5-50 acres. Access to this will be by P.R.W. No. I below.
- III. Sanna Voyakoli, muli warg No. 45 of Karadka village, demarcated by four cairns Nos. 32, 33, 34 and 35. Area 3-90 acres. Access to this will be by P.R.W. Nos. XVI and I below.
- IV. Kottangoli enclosure, comprising Kottangoli, muli warg No. 3, Pattamule, muli warg No. 14, Yedabail, muli warg Nos. 1 and 36, and Kanathurmule, muli warg No. 35, all of Karadka village, demarcated by 24 cairns Nos. 9, 9-A and 10 to 31, both inclusive. Area 54-71 acres. Access to this will be by P.R.W. Nos. VIII, VII and XII below.

B. The following easements are granted within the reserve:—

I. Permission is accorded to the cultivator for the time being of Panchapalla land, a portion of muli warg No. 21 of Adur village to use the water of a natural hollow in the reserve some two hundred and fifty yards west-south-west of cairn No. 78 of the reserve boundary by keeping clear a natural channel from that hollow to a reservoir some fifty yards east-south-east of it. The cultivator will be permitted to build a dam across the southern end of the lower tank to retain the necessary water for irrigation purposes behind it, the dimensions of the said dam not to exceed a height of two feet, the same thickness and a length of twelve feet, material for the construction of the dam which will consist of stones and earth only being obtained from the bed of the lower reservoir over an area of one hundred square yards.

For leading the water of the reservoir to the lands irrigated, the cultivator will be permitted to keep in repair two channels, one passing out of the reservoir at its north-eastern corner, passing through the reserve for about two hundred yards and quitting it eighty yards south of cairn No. 78 and the other leaving the reservoir at its south-eastern corner passing south-east through the reserve for two hundred and sixty yards and quitting it one hundred and forty yards north of cairn No. 79. Each of these channels will be three feet wide including their banks and material for their repair will be obtained from the beds of each respectively.

Right of entry into the reserve for the maintenance of the dam and repair of the channels will be by the bed of the channels and the easement will be in operation from the end of May to the end of October yearly.

II. Permission is accorded to the cultivator, for the time being, of Pene, a portion of mullu warg No. 27 of Karadka village, to repair a channel within the reserve, four feet wide, including its banks. The channel enters the reserve fifty yards south-west of cairn No. 91 from a dam outside the reserve, east of that cairn and running through it along the hill contours and quits it one hundred yards south of cairn No. 97. Its total length is about two miles. Right of entry into the reserve for the repair of the channel will be by the bed of the channel and material for such repair will be obtained also from the bed thereof from June to October yearly.

III. Permission is accorded to the cultivator, for the time being, of Nayangaya, mullu warg No. 42 of Mulliar village, to construct a dam, one foot long, three feet high and three feet thick, at the base, of stones and earth, the former being obtained from within the reserve in the vicinity of the dam and the latter from the bed of the tank twelve feet square formed above the dam at a point one hundred yards within the reserve and one hundred and thirty yards north of cairn No. 112; and to lead off water from the tank by a channel three feet wide, quitting the tank retaining embankment on its east-side and passing south-east through the reserve a distance of one hundred yards and quitting it one hundred yards north-east of cairn No. 112 of the reserve boundary. The channel will be repaired with material from its bed within the limits laid down therefor. Right of entry into the reserve for the construction of the bank and maintenance of the channel will be by the bed of the channel and the easement will be in operation from May to December yearly, both months inclusive.

C. The following public rights of way are allowed within the reserve:—

I. *Balanadka-Aranadka foot-path*, to a width of six feet for men and cattle. Enters the reserve one hundred yards south of cairn No. 66, passes through it south-eastward for two and three-fourths furlongs and quits it fifty yards south-west of cairn No. 5 of the Dudda Voyakoli enclosure; re-entering the reserve the same distance south-west of cairn No. 8 of the same enclosure, passes south-south-east four and quarter furlongs and finally quits it fifty yards south-west of cairn No. 102.

II. *Adur-Local Fund road foot-path*, to a width of four feet for men only. Enters the reserve twenty yards south of cairn No. 78, passes through it in a north-westerly direction for six furlongs and quits it at the Local Fund road from Kasragod to Jalsur.

III. *Adur-Mulliar foot-path*, to a width of six feet for men and cattle. Enters the reserve north-west of cairn No. 80 runs along the block boundary and leaves it about four chains east of the north-west corner of mullu warg No. 56 of Adur. It re-enters the block about 4-40 chains east of the south-west corner of the same field and then passing southward across the river elbow for some three furlongs and then westward the same distance and quits it on the north side of cairn No. 81; again re-entering the reserve forty yards west of cairn No. 101 passes through it following the river bank southward and quits it thirty yards west of cairn No. 102; again entering the reserve the same distance west of cairn No. 107, follows the river bank again for over a mile and finally quits the reserve on the north side of cairn No. 108.

IV. *Karmanagudde Adur foot-path*, to a width of four feet for men only. Enters the reserve sixty yards west of cairn No. 88, passes north through it for one and a half furlongs and then joins P. R. W. No. II *supra*.

V. A path six feet wide for men and cattle; it enters the reserve between cairns Nos. 90 and 90-A, one hundred yards south-south-west of cairn No. 90, passes through it in a north-westerly direction for one hundred and thirty yards to the top of the ravine and thence it will be ten feet wide to be used by carts also continuing in the same direction for some two hundred yards and quitting the reserve sixty-five yards north of cairn No. 71.

VI. *Adkivetty-Fogilada foot-path*, to a width of six feet for men and cattle. Enters the reserve thirty yards south of cairn No. 99 and passes out the same distance south-south west of that cairn; re-entering the reserve on the south side of cairn No. 98, passes through it in a generally west-north-westerly direction slightly over half a mile and finally quits it at 14 miles and 2½ furlongs on the Kasragod-Jalsur Local Fund road.

VII. *Aranadka-Kottangoli foot-path*, to a width of six feet for men and cattle. Enters the reserve hundred yards north of cairn No. 106, passes through it in a westerly direction for slightly over two furlongs and quits it hundred yards south of cairn No. 21 of the Kottangoli enclosure.

VIII. *Kottangoli Enclosure foot-path*, to a width of six feet, for men and cattle. Enters the reserve 80 yards south-west of cairn No. 110, passes through it north for half-a-mile and quits it 50 yards south-east of cairn No. 27 of Kottangoli enclosure; re-entering the reserve 160 yards north-east of cairn No. 15 of the same enclosure, passes north for 3½ furlongs and joins P. R. W. No. I *supra*.

IX. *Nayangaya-Kanathoor foot-path*, to a width of four feet, for men only. Enters the reserve one hundred yards north of cairn No. 112, passes through it in a westerly direction two furlongs and quits it sixty yards north of cairn No. 9.

X. *Nayangaya-Kundukachi foot-path*, to a width of six feet, for men and cattle. Enters the reserve thirty yards west of cairn No. 113, passes through it south westward some two furlongs and quits it seventy yards west of cairn No. 114.

XI. *Bembakal-Palikol foot-path*, to a width of six feet, for men and cattle. Enters the reserve at and on the north side of cairn No. 119, passes through it in a generally north-westerly direction some three furlongs and quits it one hundred yards south of cairn No. 6.

XII. *Madambudu-Kottangoli foot-path*, to a width of six feet, for men and cattle. Enters the reserve fifty yards south of cairn No. 12, passes through it in an east-north-easterly direction for 2½ furlongs where it joins the Kottangoli enclosure foot-path (P.R.W. No. VIII *supra*) along which it continues.

XIII. *Tayria-Panoor foot-path*, to a width of six feet, for men and cattle. Enters the reserve seventy yards south-south-west of cairn No. 26 and passing north-north-east for about one mile and quits it fifty yards west of cairn No. 3 of the Kundadka enclosure (No. 1); re-entering the reserve the same distance west of cairn No. 2 of the same enclosure, it continues west-north-west for 1½ furlongs and joins the Jalsur road 150 yards west of cairn No. 63.

XIV. *Tayria-Kundathal path*, to a width of six feet for men and cattle. Branches from P.R.W. No. XIII *supra* about 1½ furlongs from its point of entrance, runs north-west for about a furlong and quits the reserve thirty yards west of cairn No. 48-A.

XV. *Chandanagai-Narala foot-path*, to a width of six feet for men and cattle. Enters the reserve on the north side of cairn No. 59, passes through it in a north-north easterly direction for 3½ furlongs and joins the Jalsur road at 13 miles ½ furlong stone.

XVI. *Dudda and Sanna Voyakoli Enclosures path*, to a width of six feet for men and cattle. Enters the reserve twenty-five yards south of cairn No. 35 of Sanna Voyakoli enclosure, passes through it in a curve, about ¼ furlong in length and joins the path from the Local Fund road to Aranadka, P.R.W. No. I *supra*, which passes through the Dudda Voyakoli enclosure.

No. 276.—His Excellency the Governor in Council hereby notifies under the provisions of section 16 of the Madras Forest Act (V of 1882), that, from 1st November 1904, the area, the boundaries of which are given in the schedule appended to this notification, shall be constituted a "reserved forest".
