No. 445.—Under section 1 of the Madras Irrigation Cess Act, VII of 1865, as amended by Madras Act, V of 1900, His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to prescribe the following rules for the levy of water-rate on Government dry land in the delta tracts of the

RULE I.

The water-rates charged for irrigation in these tracts will be as follow:-

- (1) For a first wet crop—one rupes per acre more than the difference between the wet and the dry rates of assessment of the land according to the classification of soil and of the source of
 - (2) For a first dry crop occasionally irrigated-half the charge in clause (1).

- (i) following a first wet crop—the same charge as in clause (2) plus half the dry
- (ii) following a first dry crop occasionally irrigated—the same charge as in clause (1). (4) For a second dry crop occasionally irrigated—balf the charge as in clause (1).
- (5) When only one wet crop is raised, the charge will be as for a first wet crop irrespective. of the season in which the crop is raised.
