No. 263.—Under section 16 of the Madras Forest Act (V of 1882), the Governor in Council is pleased to declare that the area, the boundaries of which are described in the schedule below, shall be constituted a Reserved forest with effect from 15th August 1934.

SCHEDULE.

South Kanāra district, Kasaragod taluk.

[Number and name of the block—No. 224. Malottu.]

BOUNDARIES.

North.—Starting from the trjunction stone of Belur, final survey notified at page 20 of the District Gazette, dated 20th February 1934, Panathadi survey finally notified at page 36 of the District Gazette, dated 20th April 1934, and Malottu survey finally notified at page 38 of the District Gazette, dated 20th April 1934 villages, situated on the Kootakalla Guddai, the common village boundary of Malottu and Panathadi villages—F. lines 305, 267, 172, 229, 153, 557, 377, 284, 150, 541, 427, 286, 232, 117, 513, 265, 361, 199, 250, 589, 186, 243, 401, 182, 229, 305, 98, 290, 499, 223 (cutting the Pallikalam chāl at a point 123 links east of the stone at the junction of F. lines 499 and 223), 266, 793, and 442 to the north-western corner of R.S. No. 80 Malottu village; thence the western and southern sides of the same R.S. No. 30—(F. lines 194, 292, 266, 118, 500, 265) to the south-west corner of R.S. No. 31 of Malottu; thereafter the southern sides of R.S. No. 31 (F. lines 125, 513, 300, 302, 212, 244, and 117), and of R.S. No. 30 (F. line 347) to the village boundary; thence the common village boundary of Malottu and Panathadi villages (F. lines 457, 562, 70, 645, 432, 76, 86, 356, 414, 341, 844, 326, 194, 483, 376, 209, 262, 282, 318, 274, 183, 216, 189 and 341) to the trjunction stone of R.S. Nos. 32 and 112 of Malottu village and of Panathadi village.

East.—Thence the western boundary of R.S. No. 112 F. lines 327, 711, 275, 137, 43, 127, 355, 233, 383, 161, 265, 90, 180, 513, 194, 232, and 282, 159 and 227 along the locality called Aringalu Kanam and (F. lines 249, 398, 406, 238, 301, 155, 121, 157, 545, 177, 262, 338 and 173) along the locality called Alladitharu—to the village boundary.

South.—Thence from the trjunction stone of R.S. Nos. 32 and 112 of Malottu village and the boundary of Kinnanur village (survey finally notified at pages 134 and 135 of the District Gazette, 25th September 1933, situated at Mundhathadam) along the common village boundary of Malottu and Kinnanur villages—F. lines 203, 603, 390, 587, 427, 411, 724, 384, 642, 151, 348, 169, 210, 228, 198, 142, 368, 552, 257, 494, 514, 508, 505, 565, 32, 225, 505, 441; 397 and 850 (here a jungle stream called Mundathodu cuts the boundary at a distance of eight chains west of the rock mark at the junction of F. lines 397 and 850)—to the trjunction rock mark of R.S. Nos. 28 and 32 of Malottu village and the boundary of Kinnanur village; thereafter the eastern northern and western sides of R.S. No. 28 F. lines 159, 122, 132, 244, 171, 731, 933, 229, 672, 151, (the rock mark at the junction of F. lines 151 and 276 is situated on the hill slope of Pullikallu), 276, 490, 88, 383, 564, 352, 234, 227, 181, 692, 162, 427, 442, 1693, 272, 96, 95, 106, 284, 223, 338, 316, 406, 397, 1124, 657, 394, 610, 472, 120, 353, 760, 750, 400, 322, 189, 241 (and along Kandakkamale) F. lines 492, 328, 124, 144, 452, 173, 280, 327, 413, 424, 229 and 70—to the trjunction stone of Resurvey, Nos. 35 and 28 of Malottu village and the boundary of Belur villages; thence the common boundary of Malottu and Belur villages—F. lines 1166, 830, 51, 196, 738, 583, 212, 516 and 292—to the south-westernmost corner of the said R.S. No. 32.

West.—Thence the common village boundary of Malottu and Belur villages (F. lines 539, 226, 270, 293, 102, 302, 315, 165, 370, 464, 180, 65, 290, 290, 290, 336, 112, 330, 283, 234, 258, 307, 72, 74, 418, 291, 256, 200, 310, 384, 122, 457, 372, 324, 335, 301, 699, 206, 381, 317 and 106 to the starting point.

Remarks.—I. The following enclosure, which has been demarcated at Resurvey, exists free from reservation within the limits of the Reserved Forest:—

Local name.—Pallikalam; Resurvey No. 29; extent: acres 17 cents 38; assessed at annas two per acre; situated near the north-eastern corner of the western half of the Reserved Forest and near the northern boundary; contains, at present, only 'Kochi' (regrowth after heavy 'kumari' cultivation in the past); held at present, on ryotwari, tenure by Pattadar No. 10; Abdulla Beary.

Boundaries of enclosure.—North, F. lines 422, 263, 205 and 765, east, F. lines 379, 59 and 684; south, F. line 779; west, F. line 1271.

Approach path (newly prescribed) to enclosure.—It enters the reserve at the Resurvey stone at the junction of F. lines 194 of R.S. No. 80 of Malottu village and 442 of the common boundary of Malottu and Panathadi villages, runs westwards for a distance of 270 links and enters the enclosure at the north-eastern corner point of R.S. No. 29 (Rock mark at the junction of F. lines 765 and 379 of R.S. No. 29); 45 links width.

II. The following public right of way, to a width of 45 links, open to men and cattle, is admitted within the Reserved Forest:—

The foot path from Pullikallu to Koormanam—It enters the Reserved Forest northwards on its southern boundary at a point 4 links west of Resurvey stone at the junction of F. lines 490 and 276 of R.S. No. 28 of Malottu village, runs westwards and northwards for a distance of 12½ chains and leaves the Reserved Forest northwards on its northern boundary at a point 30 links east of the Resurvey rock mark connecting F. lines 500 and 265 of Resurvey No. 30 of Malottu village.

No. 264.—The following amendment will be issued to Development Department Notification No. 375, dated

the 14th October 1932, published at page 1719 of Part I of the Fort St. George Gazette, dated the 25th October 1932, as subsequently amended:—

AMENDMENT.

For the words 'Mr. Mitchell, Special Assistant Settlement Officer, No. IV Party, Mangalore' occurring in paragraph 2 of the notification, the following words shall be substituted, viz., 'the Special Assistant Settlement Officer, for the time being, in charge No. IV Party, Mangalore.'

No. 265.—In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (a) of sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Madras Agricultural Pests and Diseases Act, 1919, as subsequently amended, the Government of Madras (Ministry of Public Works) hereby declare that the plant known as 'Water Hyacinth' (*Eichhornia speciosa kunth*) is a 'noxious weed.'

2. Under clauses (b) and (c) of sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Act, the Government of Madras (Ministry of Public Works), prohibit the transport of this weed from one village to another, or its transplantation from one water-source or receptacle to another in the Bapatla taluk of the Guntur district for a period of six months from 1st October 1934 and direct that the weed wherever found in the said district be killed.

No. 266.—In connexion with the destruction of the Water Hyacinth in the Bapatla taluk of the Guntur district the following are appointed inspecting officers under section 19 of the Madras Agricultural Pests and Diseases Act of 1919, as subsequently amended:—

Revenue Inspectors, Minor Irrigation Supervisor and Overseers, Supervisors and Overseers of Public Works and Local Fund Departments (in the Bapatla taluk of the Guntur district), and Sanitary Inspectors and Overseers attached to the Chirala Municipality.

2. Under clause (f) of section 21 of the abovesaid Act, the Government (Ministry of Public Works) are pleased to direct that appeals under section 6 of the Act shall lie to the Tahsildar or Deputy Tahsildar in independent charge having jurisdiction over the water-sources or premises concerned.

No. 267.—Under section 3 of the Madras Co-operative Societies Act, 1932, the Government are pleased to appoint M.R.Ry. R. Balakrishna Ayyar, Sub-Deputy Registrar of Co-operative Societies, to assist the Registrar of Co-operative Societies; and to confer on him the powers of a Registrar under sections 15, 28, 32 (1), 37, 38, 39, 41, 51 (1), 51 (2) and 51 (3) of the Act while employed on foreign service under the Hospet Central Bank, Bellary.

No. 268.—Under the provisions of section 1 of the Madras Cattle Disease Act, 1866, the Government, Ministry of Public Works, hereby direct that the provisions of the said Act shall be put in force in the Singikulam village, Nanguneri taluk, Tinnevely district, from the 17th September to the 1st October 1934, both days inclusive.

ACQUISITION OF LAND.

Fort St. George, June 30, 1934.

Under section 6 of the Land Acquisition Act, the Governor in Council and the Governor acting with his Ministers hereby declare that the lands specified below and measuring 1.50 acres, be the same a little more or less, are needed for a public purpose, to wit, for the cultivation work at the Agricultural Research station, Aduturai; and, under sections 3 and 7 of the same Act, the Sub-Collector, Kumbakonam, is appointed to perform the functions of a Collector under the Act and directed to take order for the acquisition of the said lands. Under sub-section (1) of section 17 of the Act, the Governor in Council and the Governor Acting with his Ministers further direct that the possession of the said lands may be taken on the expiry of fifteen days from the date of the publication of the notice mentioned in section 11 of the Act. A plan of the lands is kept in the office of the Sub-Collector, Kumbakonam, and may be inspected at any time during office hours.
