No. 568.—The Governor in Council is pleased to declare, under the provisions of section 16 of the Madras Forest Act (V of 1882), that, from 1st April 1907 the area, the boundaries of which are set forth in the schedule below, shall be a "reserved forest":—

REMARKS A.—The following cultivations are demarcated and treated as enclosures within the reserve, free from reservation:—

- I. Melvadambale-Neltherige enclosure—consisting of survey No. 203 of Mandekole.
 - II. Kelavadambale enclosure—consisting of survey No. 214 of Mandekole village with a margin of fifty yards all round.
 - III. Kajila enclosure.—Boundaries.—Starting from cairn No. 1 at the westernmost corner of survey No. 150, the north side of that survey number to cairn No. 2 at its northernmost corner; thence the east side of that survey number and of survey No. 149 to cairn No. 3 at the easternmost corner of the latter number; thence a straight line to cairn No. 4 at the south-eastern corner of the latter survey number; thence its south side to cairn No. 5 at its south-western corner; thence its west side to cairn No. 6 at its westernmost corner; thence a straight line to the starting point. (*Both the survey numbers belong to Mandekole village.*)
 - IV. Margi or Halkoc hi enclosure—consisting of survey No. 323 of Mandekole.
 - V. Darmaniru enclosure—consisting of survey No. 97 of Ajjavar.
 - VI. Melina Chikote enclosure.—Boundaries.—Starting from cairn No. 1 at the north-western corner of survey No. 236 a straight line to cairn No. 2 at the north-western corner of survey No. 235; thence the north side of that survey number to cairn No. 3 at its north-eastern corner; thence a straight line in a south-easterly direction for twenty-eight yards to cairn No. 4; thence a straight line in a south-south-westerly direction for fifty yards to cairn No. 5; thence a straight line to cairn No. 6 at the south-western corner of survey No. 235; thence a straight line to cairn No. 7 at the southernmost corner of survey No. 236; thence the west side of survey No. 236 to the starting point (*both the survey numbers mentioned above belong to Mandekole village.*)
 - VII. Kundapare enclosure.—Boundaries.—Starting from cairn No. 1 at the second survey stone on the northern side of survey No. 234 of Mandekole counted from its westernmost corner, a straight line to cairn No. 2 at the third survey stone on the same side of the same survey number counted from its easternmost corner; thence a straight line in an east by north direction for one furlong to cairn No. 3; thence a straight line for nearly a furlong in a south-westerly direction to cairn No. 4 at its south-eastern corner; thence its south side to cairn No. 5 at its southernmost corner; thence a straight line westward for eight chains to cairn No. 6 two and a half chains due west of its westernmost corner; thence a straight line to the starting point.
 - VIII. Kelogina-Chakote enclosure.—Boundaries.—Starting from cairn No. 1 five chains north-west of the north-western corner of survey No. 242 of Mandekole village, a straight line to cairn No. 2 opposite to its north-eastern corner on the right bank of the Bolugallu stream; thence up that stream for five chains to cairn No. 3 on the same bank of it; thence a straight line to cairn No. 4 two chains south-east of the southernmost corner of the said survey number; thence a straight line to the starting point.
 - IX. Bengadumale enclosure.—Boundaries.—Starting from cairn No. 1 at the northernmost corner of survey No. 238, a straight line to cairn No. 2 at the north-eastern corner of survey No. 239; thence a straight line for about two hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 3 situated one hundred yards north-east of the northernmost point of survey No. 240; thence south by east for two hundred and seventy-five yards to cairn No. 4 situated sixty yards east by south of the south-eastern corner of survey No. 241; thence a straight line north-west to cairn No. 5 at the southernmost corner of survey No. 241; thence a straight line north-west to cairn No. 6 at the south-western corner of survey No. 240; thence a straight line west by north to cairn No. 7 at the southernmost corner of survey No. 238; thence the south side of that survey number to cairn No. 8 at its south-western corner; thence along its west side to the starting point. (*All the above survey numbers belong to Mandekole village.*)
 - X. Basavanagundi enclosure—consisting of survey No. 271 of Adur kasba with one hundred yards' kumaki all round.
 - XI. Muchanthulli enclosure.—consisting of survey No. 270 of Adur kasba with one hundred yards' kumaki all round.
 - XII. Kutukaje-Kanurkaje-Mavinadi enclosure.—Boundaries.—Starting from cairn No. 1, one hundred and fifty yards due west of the westernmost corner of survey No. 260, a straight line to cairn No. 2, five chains due north of its northernmost corner; thence a straight line to cairn No. 3, eight chains east-south-east of the same corner; thence a straight line to cairn No. 4 five chains east-south-east of the south-eastern corner of survey No. 261; thence a straight line to cairn No. 5 five chains north-east of the north-eastern corner of survey No. 262; thence a straight line to cairn No. 6 five chains east of its south eastern corner; thence a straight line to cairn No. 7, one hundred and fifty yards south of the southernmost corner of survey No. 263; thence a straight line to the starting point. (*All the survey numbers mentioned above belong to Adur kasba village.*)
 - XIII. Yerkalpa ty-Hosagadde enclosure—consisting of survey No. 219 of Mandekole.
- B.—The following rights of way are allowed within the reserve for men and cattle to a width of six feet:—
- (1) *Puroje-Akhopady footpath.*—Enters the reserve four hundred and fifty-four yards south-south-west of cairn No. 1 runs north-east for about three and half furlongs and quits it seven chains south-south-west of cairn No. 2.
 - (2) *Kalladka-Vadambale-Mithila bail footpath.*—Enters the reserve four chains east by north of cairn No. 165 runs south-west for two furlongs and touches Melvadambale enclosure (survey No. 208 of Mandekole) at its north-eastern corner. It then runs south-south-east for two and half furlongs and enters Kelavadambale enclosure (survey No. 214 of Mandekole) at its north-western corner. It enters the reserve again at the south-eastern corner of the same enclosure runs south-east for a furlong and half and quits the reserve finally three chains south-west of the same enclosure runs south-east for two and half furlongs and quits the reserve five yards north by east of cairn No. 166.
 - (3) *Kalladka-Mandekole bail footpath.*—Enters the reserve five yards north by east of cairn No. 166 runs south-east and then east for two and half furlongs and quits the reserve five yards south by east of cairn No. 166 runs south-east then south for about three and quarters furlongs and quit the reserve eight and half chains west by north of cairn No. 75.
 - (4) *Mandekole bail-Mithila bail footpath.*—Enters the reserve three chains north of cairn No. 10 runs south-west and then south for about three and quarters furlongs and quit the reserve eight and half chains west by north of cairn No. 75.

(5) *Mandekole bail-Tanjimale footpath.*—Enters the reserve on the right bank of the Mandekole stream opposite the easternmost corner of survey No. 166 of Mandekole, runs north-east for about two and one-fourth furlongs and quits the reserve at cairn No. 19.

(6) *Mithilabail-Matanjadka-Mandekole bail footpath.*—Enters the reserve seventy yards south-west of cairn No. 73, runs north-east for about three and one-fourth furlongs and quits the reserve four chains east of cairn No. 69. It again enters the reserve four chains north-east of cairn No. 68 runs west by north for about two furlongs and quits the reserve two chains east-north-east of cairn No. 12.

(7) *Mandekole bail-Kenje bail footpath.*—Enters the reserve on the right bank of the Mandekole stream opposite the easternmost corner of survey No. 166 of Mandekole runs east for about four and half furlongs and quits the reserve four chains south-west of cairn No. 66. It again enters the reserve three chains south-south-east of the same cairn runs east by north for about six and a half furlongs and quits the reserve finally three chains north of cairn No. 35.

(8) *Kenje-Kajila footpath.*—Enters the reserve three chains north of cairn No. 35 runs west by north for about two and three-fourths furlongs and quits the reserve midway between cairns Nos. 3 and 4 of the Kajila enclosure.

(9) *Kanenuvadka-Kajila-Muroor footpath.*—Enters the reserve three chains south-south-east of cairn No. 66, runs north-east for about four furlongs and enters the Kajila enclosure midway between cairns Nos. 1 and 6. It again enters the reserve midway between 1 and 2 of that enclosure, runs due north for two furlongs and quits the reserve on the left bank of the Payaswami river.

(10) *Adur-Sullia footpath.*—Enters the reserve at cairn No. 155 runs north-east for about three and a quarter furlongs touching the northern corner of Yerkalpady-Hosagadde enclosure No. XIII, and quits the reserve thirteen chains north of cairn No. 79. It again enters the reserve at cairn No. 65 runs east-south-east for about two furlongs and gets out of the reserve at cairn No. 63. It again enters the reserve two chains north of cairn No. 60 runs east for about five furlongs and finally quits the reserve at cairn No. 49.

(11) *Footpath to Marga (Halkochi) enclosure.*—Enters the reserve two chains west of cairn No. 62 and runs north for six chains and enters the enclosure at its southernmost corner.

(12) *Footpath to Darmaniru enclosure.*—It branches off from the Adur Sullia footpath one and a half furlongs west of its final exit from the reserve, runs north for three chains and enters the enclosure at its southernmost corner.

(13) *Footpath from Mithilabail to Bolugallu, Bengadamale, Kelagina Chakote and Mela Chakote.*—Enters the reserve four chains east of cairn No. 86, runs south-south-east for about four furlongs and quits the reserve three chains north-east of cairn No. 88. It again enters the reserve forty five yards west of cairn No. 94, runs south by west for three hundred and sixty five yards and quits the reserve at cairn No. 3 of Bengadamale enclosure. It again enters the reserve at cairn No. 5 of the same enclosure, runs south for one hundred and seventy yards and enters the Kelagina Chakote enclosure at cairn No. 1 of that enclosure. It again enters the reserve at cairn No. 3 of the same enclosure runs east for two furlongs and quits the reserve finally at cairn No. 1 of the Melina Chakote enclosure.

(14) *Bengadamale-Kundapare footpath.*—Enters the reserve at cairn No. 3 of the Bengadamale enclosure runs south-east for one and a half furlongs and enters the Kundapare enclosure at cairn No. 6 of that enclosure.

(15) *Bolugallu-Mawanji footpath.*—Enters the reserve one hundred yards north by east of cairn No. 99, runs east by south for four furlongs and quits the reserve ninety yards north by east of cairn No. 110.

(16) *Footpath to Movinudi-Kanurkaja-Katukaji enclosure.*—Enters the reserve four chains south of cairn No. 151, runs south by east for about two furlongs and enters the enclosure midway between its cairns Nos. 1 and 2.

(17) *Samacochi-Palar footpath.*—Enters the reserve at cairn No. 131 runs south-east for about one furlong and quits it at cairn No. 129. It again enters the reserve at cairn No. 128, runs east for about a furlong and a half and quits the reserve at cairn No. 125.

(18) *Footpath to Dusavenagundi enclosure.*—Enters the reserve twelve chains west of cairn No. 128 runs north for one furlong and enters the enclosure midway between its cairns Nos. 3 and 4.

(19) *Footpath to Muchanthulli enclosure.*—Enters the reserve at cairn No. 128 and runs north up a hill slope for five furlongs entering the enclosure at its south-eastern corner.

C.—The following rights to water are admitted within the reserve:—

I. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey No. 207 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a spring tank five yards square about a furlong south-west of cairn No. 162 and to take its water for the irrigation of the said survey number by a channel two feet by two feet running north from it for sixty-five yards and joining the channel running to the same survey number from tank mentioned *infra* in item II. Materials for the repair of the tank and the channel should be obtained from their respective beds; access to the tank and the channel should be through the beds of this channel and the channel referred to in item II *infra*.

II. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey No. 207 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a tank near a jungle stream ten yards square about eight chains south-east of the southernmost corner of the said survey number and to divert its water for the irrigation of the said fields by a channel two feet by two feet running north-west for about four hundred yards and quitting the reserve two chains south-east of cairn No. 161. Materials for the repair of the tank should be obtained from the bed of the stream in which it lies and those for the channel should be obtained from the bed of the channel. Access to the dam and the channel will be by the channel bed.

III. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey No. 207 of Mandekole, the right to construct a stone dam six yards long, one yard broad and one yard high across the jungle stream mentioned in item II *supra* about half a furlong south-east of the southernmost corner of the said survey number and to take the water collected by the dam for the irrigation of the said survey number by a channel two feet by two feet running north by west for about one hundred and ten yards and quitting the reserve at cairn No. 162. Materials for the repairs of the dam should be obtained from the bed of the stream and those for the channel should be obtained from the bed of the channel. Access to the dam and the channel will be by the channel bed.

IV. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey No. 210 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a round tank ten feet square with a bund ten feet by two feet by two feet at its southern edge and situated on a hill slope fifty yards south of the southern margin of the said survey number and to take its water for the irrigation of the said survey number by a channel two feet broad and two feet deep running straight north for ten yards and quitting the reserve about forty-five yards east of cairn No. 164. Materials for the repairs of the tank and the channel should be obtained from their respective beds and access to them should be through the bed of the channel.

V. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey No. 169 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a tank thirty yards long from north to south and ten yards broad from east to west lying about one hundred and ninety yards west of the line between cairns Nos. 2 and 3 and to take its water for the irrigation of the said survey number by a channel two feet broad and two feet deep running north-east from the tank for about a furlong and quitting the reserve midway between cairns Nos. 2 and 3. Materials for the repairs of the tank and the channel should be obtained from their respective beds. Access to the tank and the channel should be by the bed of the latter.

VI. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey No. 171 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a tank five yards square in the bed of a jungle stream about two furlongs west by north of the westernmost corner of the said survey number for the purpose of replenishing the said stream in the hot weather. Materials for the repair of the tank should be obtained from, and access to the tank should be through, the bed of the stream in which the tank lies.

VII. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey No. 168 of Mandekole, the right to construct a stone dam eleven yards long, one yard broad and one yard high across a jungle stream about sixty yards to the west of the western margin of the said survey number and to divert the water collected by the dam for the irrigation of the said survey number by a channel two feet broad and two feet deep running east for about sixty yards and quitting the reserve about ten yards north-west of cairn No. 8. Materials for the repair of the dam should be obtained from the bed of the stream and those for the repair of the channel should be obtained from its bed. Access to the dam and the channel should be by the bed of the latter.

VIII. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey No. 142 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a tank nine yards square lying about a furlong north of survey No. 142-8 and to take its water for the said survey number by a channel two feet broad and two feet deep, which runs south for about ninety yards quitting the reserve about two hundred and forty yards west of cairn No. 32. Materials for the repair of the tank and the channel should be obtained from their respective beds, and access to them should be through the bed of the channel.

IX. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey Nos. 98 and 110, 106 Ajjavar the right to bring the water from a swamp (survey No. 97 of Ajjavar, enclosure No. V) for the irrigation of the said survey numbers by a channel two feet broad and two feet deep running south for about one hundred yards and branching into two branches, one of which runs south-west for half a furlong and quits the reserve midway between cairns Nos. 53 and 54 and the other runs south-east for two hundred and sixty-five yards and quits the reserve at cairn No. 51. Materials for the repair of the channels should be obtained from and access to them should be through their beds.

X. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey No. 320 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a tank eight yards square situated in the bed of a jungle stream about half a furlong north of the north-eastern corner of the said survey number and to take the water collected by the tank for the irrigation of the said survey number by the stream running south and quitting the reserve sixty-five yards north-west of cairn No. 61. Materials required for the repair of the tank should be obtained from and access to it should be through the bed of the jungle stream in which it is situated.

XI. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey No. 329 of Mandekole, the right to construct a dam five yards long, one foot broad and one foot high across the jungle stream referred to in item X *supra* about half a furlong north of the north-eastern corner of survey No. 320 of Mandekole and immediately above the tank referred to in the same item and to divert the water collected by the dam for the irrigation of the said survey No. 329 of Mandekole by a channel one yard broad and one yard deep running south for one hundred and twenty yards and quitting the reserve twenty-five yards north-west of cairn No. 61. Materials for the dam should be obtained from the bed of the jungle stream and those for the channel from its own bed. Access to the dam and the channel should be by the bed of the channel.

XII. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey No. 320 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a tank fifteen yards square with a stone dam fifteen yards long, one yard broad and one yard high on its southern edge situated about one hundred and fifty yards due north-west of the northernmost corner of survey No. 323 of Mandekole (Marga or Halkochi enclosure) and to take its water for the irrigation of the said survey No. 320 by a channel one yard broad and one yard deep running south-east for one hundred and ninety yards and quitting the reserve on the west side of the said survey No. 323, again entering the reserve at the southernmost point of that survey number and running south for one hundred and thirty-two yards and quitting the reserve at cairn No. 62. Materials for the repair of the tank and the dam should be obtained from the bed of the tank and those for the repair of the channel from its bed. Access to the tank, dam and channel should be through the bed of the channel.

XIII. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey No. 320 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a tank ten yards square in the bed of a jungle stream about one and a three-quarter furlongs due north of survey No. 313 of Mandekole and replenishing the said stream in the hot season. Materials for the repair of the tank should be obtained from and access to it should be through the bed of the stream in which it lies.

XIV. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey Nos. 313 and 314 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a tank ten yards square situated about a furlong and a quarter direct north of survey No. 313 and to take its water for the irrigation of the said survey numbers by a channel two feet broad and two feet deep running south for one hundred and eighty yards and quitting the reserve eighty-five yards west by south of cairn No. 63. Materials for the repair of the tank and the channel should be obtained from their respective beds and access to them should be through the bed of the channel.

XV. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey Nos. 153 and 160 of Mandekole, the right to maintain (1) a tank ten yards square lying seven chains east by north of the north-eastern corner of survey No. 160; (2) a circular tank six yards in diameter lying one hundred and twenty yards due south of the above-mentioned tank; (3) another tank six yards long and three yards broad and situate seventy yards due east of the tank No. (1) and to take the water from tanks (2) and (3) to tank No. (1) by two channels each two feet broad and two feet deep to tank No. (1) and thence to take the water of tank No. (1) for the irrigation of the said survey numbers by a channel two feet broad and two feet deep running west for half a furlong and quitting the reserve one hundred and thirty yards south-east of cairn No. 66. Materials for the repair of the tanks and channels should be obtained from their respective beds and access to the tanks and channels should be through the respective channels.

XVI. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey Nos. 164 to 166 and 169 to 172 of Mandekole, the right to take the water collected by two big dams thrown across the Kankar stream near survey No. 161 and outside the reserve boundary by a channel three yards deep and five feet broad entering the reserve two chains south-west of cairn No. 67, running north-west through the reserve for about two furlongs and quitting it at cairn No. 14. Repairs to the channel should be effected with materials obtained from its bed and access to the channel should be through its bed.

XVII. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey No. 166 of Mandekole, the right to maintain an irrigation channel five feet broad and up to eighteen feet deep entering the reserve about forty-five yards north-east of cairn No. 73 and running east-north-east for about two furlongs and thence north for one hundred and forty yards and quitting the reserve sixteen yards east of cairn No. 69 and again entering the reserve ten yards north-east of cairn No. 68, running west by north for four hundred yards and finally quitting the reserve fifteen yards south of cairn No. 12. Also to maintain a branch channel two feet broad and two feet deep for the irrigation of survey No. 257 of Mandekole, branching off from the aforesaid channel at a point about one hundred and thirty-five yards south of cairn No. 69 running north to east for about two hundred yards and quitting the reserve one hundred and forty yards east of cairn No. 69. Materials for the repair of the channels should be obtained from their respective beds and access to them should be by their beds.

XVIII. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey Nos. 250 and 256 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a tank ten yards square situated in the bed of a jungle stream about two hundred and fifty yards north-west of survey No. 256. Materials for the repair of the tank should be obtained from and access to it should be through the bed of the stream.

XIX. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey Nos. 250 and 251 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a tank ten yards square situated in the bed of a jungle stream about three hundred yards north of the northernmost corner of survey No. 251 and meant to replenish the stream. Materials for the repair of the tank should be obtained from and access to it should be through the bed of the stream.

XX. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey No. 252 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a tank five yards square situated in the bed of a jungle stream one hundred and fifty yards north-east of cairn No. 75 and meant to replenish the stream. Materials for the repair of the tank should be obtained from the bed of the stream in which it lies and access to it will be through the bed of the same stream.

XXI. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of survey Nos. 215 and 216 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a tank five yards square situated in the bed of a jungle stream about one hundred and fifty yards north-west of cairn No. 78 and meant to replenish the stream and to construct a dam five yards long, one yard broad and one yard high across the same stream thirty yards higher up from the aforesaid tank and to divert the water collected by the dam for the irrigation of the said survey number by a channel two feet broad and two feet deep running south-east for one hundred and ninety yards and quitting the reserve twenty yards east of cairn No. 78. Materials for the repair of the tank and the construction of the dam should be obtained from the bed of the stream and access to the tank should be through the bed of the stream. Materials for the repair of the channel should be obtained from its bed and access to the dam and the channel should be through the bed of the latter.

XXII. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators for the time being of survey No. 216 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a tank ten yards square situated in the bed of a jungle stream about four hundred yards south by east of cairn No. 86 and meant to replenish the stream and to construct a stone dam ten yards long one yard wide and one yard high across the same jungle stream about two hundred yards lower down from the aforesaid tank and to divert the water collected by the dam for the irrigation of the said survey number by a channel two feet broad and two feet deep running northward for about one hundred and ninety yards and quitting the reserve sixty yards east of cairn No. 86. Materials for the repair of the tank should be obtained from and access to it should be through the bed of the stream in which it lies. Materials for the repair of the dam should be obtained from the bed of the stream and those for the repair of the channel from its own bed. Access to the dam and the channel should be through the bed of the latter.

XXIII. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators for the time being of survey Nos. 229 and 232 of Mandekole, the right to construct a dam five yards long one yard broad and one yard high across the Bolugallu stream about one and a half furlongs south of the warg and to divert the water collected by the dam for the irrigation of the said survey numbers by a channel one yard broad and one yard deep which runs north for about a furlong and a half and quits the reserve midway between cairns Nos. 93 and 94. Materials for the construction of the dam should be obtained from the bed of the stream and those for the repair of the channel should be obtained from its own bed. Access to the dam and the channel should be through the bed of the latter.

XXIV. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators for the time being of survey No. 249 of Mandekole, the right to maintain a tank ten yards square at the head of a jungle stream inside survey No. 244 of the same village and meant to replenish the stream to maintain another tank sixteen yards broad and eighteen yards long situated fifty yards south-east of cairn No. 99 lower down in the bed of the same jungle stream and to take the water of the lower tank for the irrigation of survey No. 249 by a channel one yard broad and two feet deep running north-west for fifty yards and quitting the reserve at cairn No. 99. Materials for the repairs of both the tanks should be obtained from the bed of the stream. Access to the upper tank should be by the bed of the stream and access to the lower and the channel should be by the bed of the channel. Materials for the repair of the channel should be obtained from its own bed.

XXV. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators for the time being of survey No. 262 of Mandekole, (a) the right to maintain a tank ten yards square in the bed of a jungle stream one hundred yards south of the said survey number and to take its water for the irrigation of the said survey number by a channel two feet broad and two feet deep running north for forty yards and quitting the reserve forty yards east of cairn No. 101 and (b) the right to construct a dam five yards long, one yard broad and one yard high across the said stream about forty yards lower down from the aforesaid tank and to divert the water collected by the dam for the irrigation of the said survey number by a channel two feet broad and two feet deep running north for about twenty yards and quitting the reserve twenty yards east of cairn No. 101. Materials for the repair of the tank and the construction of the dam should be obtained from the bed of the stream and those for the repair of the channels should be obtained from their own beds. Access to the tank, dam and channels should be through the bed of the respective channels.

XXVI. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators for the time being of survey No. 278 of Mandekole, the right to maintain two tanks each five yards square situated in the beds of two jungle streams one hundred and fifteen yards and seventy yards west and south-west respectively of cairns Nos. 111 and 110 and meant to replenish the said streams. Materials for the repairs of the tanks should be obtained from and access to them should be through the beds of the respective streams in which they lie.

XXVII. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators for the time being of survey No. 292 of Mandekole, the right to construct a dam ten yards long, one yard broad and one yard high across the Mavanje stream at a point about two hundred and twenty yards south of cairn No. 120 and immediately west of the reserve. Materials for the repair of the dam should be obtained from bed of the stream and access to the dam should be through the bed of the channel which runs inside Aletti I reserve.

XXVIII. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators for the time being of survey No. 289 of Mandekole the right to construct a dam fifteen yards long two yards broad and one yard high across the Mavanje stream three furlongs south by west of cairn No. 120 and to divert the water collected by the dam by a channel one yard broad and one yard deep running north for about half a mile and quitting the reserve two hundred and fifty yards west of cairn No. 119. Materials for the dam should be obtained from the bed of the stream and those for the repair of the channel from its own bed. Access to the dam and the channel should be by the bed of the latter.

XXIX. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators for the time being of survey No. 240 of Mandekole the right to maintain a tank five yards square situated two hundred and thirty-five yards west of the north-western corner of the said survey number and to take its water for the irrigation of the said survey number by a channel running east for one hundred and thirty yards and quitting the reserve forty-four yards south-east of cairn No. 7 of Bergdamale enclosure IX. Materials for the repair of the tank and the channel should be obtained from their respective beds and access to the tank and the channel should be through the bed of the latter.

XXX. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators for the time being of survey No. 265 of Adur kasbah the right to maintain an irrigation channel two feet broad and two feet deep which leaves Basavanagundi enclosure No. X Nos. 128 and 129. Materials for the repair of the channel should be obtained from its bed and access to it should also be through its bed.

XXXI. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators for the time being of survey No. 264 of Adur kasbah the right to take the water of the Bandaka stream for the irrigation of the said survey number by a channel half yard broad and half yard deep entering the reserve at cairn No. 129 running west by north for two hundred and fifty yards and quitting its bed and sides, and access to the channel should be through its bed.

XXXII. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators for the time being of survey No. 137 of Adur kasbah the right to construct two stone dams across a jungle stream flowing south from a hill called Koudikan inside the reserve and to take the water collected by the said dams for the irrigation of the said survey number by channels running south through the reserve. The upper dam which is fifteen yards long, one yard broad and one yard high, is situated about a furlong north-east of cairn No. 134 and the channel issuing from it is one yard broad and one yard high, runs generally south for two hundred yards and quits the reserve twenty yards south-east of cairn No. 134; the lower dam which is twelve yards long, two yards broad and one yard high, is situated about sixty yards lower down the course of the stream from the site of the upper dam and the channel issuing from it is four feet broad and two feet deep runs generally south for one hundred and thirty yards and quits the reserve fifty yards south-east of cairn No. 134. Materials for the upkeep of the dams should be obtained from the bed of the stream and materials for the repairs of the channel should be obtained from the beds. Access to the channels and the dams should be through the beds of the former.

XXXIII. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators for the time being of survey No. 279 of Adur kasbah the right to construct a dam thirty yards long, one yard broad and one yard high across a jungle stream at a point one hundred and twenty yards east of the eastern margin of the said survey number and to divert the water collected by the dam for the irrigation of the said survey number by a channel one and a half yards wide and one and a half yards deep, No. 159. Materials for the construction of the dam and the repair of the channel should be obtained from the bed of the stream and the channel respectively and access to them should be by the bed of the channel.

XXXIV. On behalf of the cultivator or cultivators for the time being of survey Nos. 249 and 262 of Mandekole the right to maintain a tank 16 yards X 18 yards, situated about one hundred and thirty-five yards south-east of the south-eastern corner of the former survey number, or fifty yards south-east of the tank by a channel one yard broad and two feet deep running north-west of cairn No. 99 and to lead off water from the tank No. 99. Materials for the repairs of the tank and the channel should be obtained from their respective beds and access to them should be through the bed of the channel.

D.—The following places of public worship will be demarcated out and treated as enclosures within the reserve and the public will be permitted to worship therein :—

(1) The place called Koudikan on the top of a hill inside the reserve being four acres in extent and situated midway between the Koochi cultivation (Nelterige holdings 4 and 5) of Adur Casbah and the Muohanthulli enclosure No. XI. Access to it shall be for men only by the path known as "Shalamara" path, twelve feet wide entering the enclosure midway between cairns Nos. 148 and 149 and running south-east for a distance of about one mile to the enclosure.

(2) The bhutastan known as Nagabrahma bhutastan with a space of ten yards all round it and situated one hundred and ninety yards south of cairn No. 86. Access to it shall be for men only by a path three feet entering the reserve at cairn No. 86 and running south for one hundred and ninety yards to the enclosure.

E.—The following right to produce is admitted within the reserve on behalf of Thiumappa Gowda, son of Putta Gowda, of Mandekole and his heirs :—

The right to collect and enjoy the produce of the jack and mango trees standing at present on survey No. 244 of Mandekole village and to remove the said trees when they die and to enter the said survey number through the bed of the jungle stream flowing down therefrom, for the purpose of manuring the said trees and guarding and collecting their produce. The claimant and his heirs will be free to sell or barter the produce of the said trees.

No. 569.—The Governor in Council is pleased to declare, under the provisions of section 16 of the Madras Forest Act (V of 1862), that from 1st March 1907 the area, the boundaries of which are set forth in the schedule below, shall be constituted a "reserved forest" :—

REMARKS.—The following public rights of way have been allowed :—

(i) *Cart-track to a width of six yards from Kallumadi to Kanumpalli.*—This enters the reserve about one chain east of the south-west corner of survey No. 337 B of Kallumadi and running south-west for about one and a quarter furlongs leaves it into the Illur reserved forest.

(ii) *Cart-track to a width of five yards from Kallumadi to Guminepalli.*—This enters the reserve about three chains west of the south-east corner of survey No. 337 B of Kallumadi and running in a southerly direction for about three furlongs leaves it at the north-east corner of survey No. 325 of the same village.

(iii) *Cart-track from Kallumadi to survey No. 342 and other cultivated fields south of the reserve to a width of five yards.*—This enters the reserve about two and a half chains east of the south-west corner of the survey No. 348 of Kallumadi and running south for about one and three quarter furlongs leaves it about three chains west of the north-east corner of survey No. 342 of the same village.

(iv) *Foot-path from Kallumadi to Chintanakalopalli to a width of two yards.*—This enters the reserve about two and a half chains east of the south-west corner of survey No. 348 of Kallumadi and running south-east for about seven furlongs leaves it about one chain south of the north-west corner of survey No. 767 of Tarimela.
