No. XXII two hundred yards to cairn No. 148 to the north-east of Jadikalmule (muli warg No. 65 of Mulliar); thence west-south-west one hundred and eighty yards to cairn No. 149 and south-south-east three hundred and fifteen yards to cairn No. 150 to the north of Navothungalmule; thence west-north-west two hundred yards to cairn No. 151, south-south-east two hundred and forty yards to cairn No. 152 on Paridale motte, south-east one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 153 on Kundupila motte; thence south slightly west two hundred and ninety yards to cairn No. 154 to the north of Ambalamule cultivation; thence west-south-west three hundred and forty-five yards to cairn No. 155; then west-north-west crossing P.R.W. No. III one hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 156 and again west-south-west one hundred and twenty-five yards to cairn No. 157; thence passing north slightly east over a hill for two furlongs to cairn No. 161 on Chedrahnedadka to the south-east of the eastern arm of muli warg No. 26 of Mulliar; thence north-north-west crossing P.R.W. No. XXIII two hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 165, to the north-east of the same warg; thence west-south-west one furlong to cairn No. 166; then passing round the darkhast lands of muli warg No. 141 of Mulliar and Beltamule of muli warg No. 26 of the same village, north-north-east two hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 166-A; north slightly east two hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 166-B, west-north-west the same distance to cairn No. 166-C, and south-west three hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 167; then passing round Vombule cultivation north-north-west two hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 168, north-west crossing P.R.W. No. II one hundred and twenty-five yards to cairn No. 168-A, south-west seventy yards to cairn No. 169, south slightly east three hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 170, and south-south-east one hundred and seventy-five yards to cairn No. 171; thence west for about four hundred and ten yards to Lingana mule (cairn No. 172); and thence south-south-west about two hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 173; thence west-north-west crossing P.R.W. No. XXIV about three hundred and eighty yards to cairn No. 174 and north-north-west one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 175 and north by west for about three hundred and ninety yards to a pare (cairn No. 176); thence west by north for about four hundred yards to cairn No. 177; and thence north-north-west about six hundred and ten yards to the starting point.</p>



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REMARKS.—A. The following are demarcated out as enclosures within the reserve, themselves free from reservation, rights of way thereto being as shown below :—  
 I. *Hiriyannadka darkhast* muli wargs Nos. 67 and 124 of Mulliar village, demarcated out by four cairns, right of way thereto being by P.R.W. Nos. I, IV, V, XXI, XXV and XXVI below.  
 II. *The portion of muli warg No. 68 of Mulliar*, area 69 cents, lying to the east of the line between cairns Nos. 58 and 59 and about one hundred and twenty yards south-east of the latter cairn, demarcated out with kumaki therefor by four cairns, right of way thereto being by P.R.W. No. X below.—

B. The following *Bhutastans* or shrine easements are admitted :—  
*Easement Nos. 1 and 2.*—Permission is accorded to members of Nair and Tiyar castes to perform worship at two *Bhutastans* within the reserve. The first situate one hundred yards south-south-east of cairn No. 4 and on the east side of P.R.W. No. II by which access to the *Bhutastan* is permitted and the second being some three hundred and fifty yards north-north-east of cairn No. 166-B and fifty yards south-west of the junction of P.R.W. Nos. I and III, both of which paths serve as access to the *Bhutastan*. The latter shrine will be open to the public of all castes. These *Bhutastans* will not be demarcated out as enclosures within the reserve free from reservation but right to worship thereat by individuals which will consist only of depositing offerings will be permitted generally throughout the year and a special ceremony may be performed in the month of October yearly at the shrines.

C. The following water easements are admitted within the reserve :—

Easement No. 3.—Permission is accorded to the cultivator, for the time being, of muli warg No. 69 of Mulliar village to repair a dam across the north-eastern end of a tank ten yards within the reserve and two hundred and thirty yards south-east of cairn No. 8, with stones and earth taken from the bed of the tank. The height of the dam will not exceed three feet; also to lead off water therefrom by a channel three feet wide, including its banks an ten yards long running north-east from the tank through the reserve. Right of entry into the reserve for the maintenance of the band and channel will be by the bed of the channel. The easement will be in operation from September to the January following yearly.

Easement No. 4.—Permission is accorded to the cultivator, for the time being, of muli warg No. 5 of Mulliar village to deepen a tank of about twenty-five square yards, less than ten yards within the reserve, between cairns Nos. 65 and 66 and to lead off water therefrom by a channel, three feet wide including its banks, passing through the reserve southward for some eight yards and issuing from it one hundred and forty yards west of cairn No. 65; right of entry into the reserve for the deepening of the tank and repair of the channel will be by the bed of the channel and with material taken from within the limits proposed for the beds of each from October to December yearly.

D. The following rights of way through the reserve are provided for the use of the public :—

I. Kasaragod-Hiriyannadka bandy-track, to a width of ten feet for men, cattle and carts, enters the reserve one furlong east by south of cairn No. 1, passes through it in a generally easterly direction for nearly two miles and quits it fifty yards south of cairn No. 1 of the Hiriyannadka enclosure; continuing as a foot-path, four feet wide for men only, it re-enters the reserve twenty yards south of cairn No. 4 of that enclosure, passes east-north-east for half a mile and again leaves it one hundred yards south-east of cairn No. 21; again entering that reserve on the north side of cairn No. 25, it passes east-north-east for some one hundred and eighty yards and finally quits it twenty yards south of cairn No. 29, proceeding thence to Kantur.

II. Mulliar-Pombemule foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve to the west of cairn No. 4, passes through it in a southerly direction for two and a half furlongs and quits it to the east of cairn No. 168-A. This path will be allowed to a width of ten feet for men, cattle and carts from the point of its entrance into the reserve to its junction with P.R.W. No. 1.

III. Mulliar-Tiadka foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve forty yards west of cairn No. 6, passes through it south-south-east one furlong and then joins the Hiriyannadka bandy-track along which it proceeds for about one hundred and forty yards; then turning southward it passes generally south some seven furlongs and quits the reserve on the west side of cairn No. 165.

IV. Bellipadi-Hiriyannadka foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve sixty yards north-west of cairn No. 10, passes through it south-south-east one hundred and fifty yards and then joins the Hiriyannadka bandy-track.

V. Kamankote-Hiriyannadka foot-path, to a width of four feet for men only, enters the reserve one hundred yards north-west of cairn No. 15, passes through it south-south-west for one and a half furlongs and quits it two furlongs east of cairn No. 1 of the Hiriyannadka enclosure.

VI. Koratikundu foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve forty yards west of cairn No. 24, passes through it south-east for nearly two furlongs and quits it on the south side of cairn No. 33.

VII. Kundukand-Mundakadu foot-path, to a width of four feet for men only, enters the reserve twenty yards west of cairn No. 48, passes through it south for two hundred and sixty yards and quits it on the west side of cairn No. 64.

VIII. Sudukudu-Chambalangaya foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve one hundred and fifty yards west of cairn No. 62, passes through it in a southerly direction, two furlongs and quits it fifty yards west of cairn No. 63.

IX. Mianianga-Chambalangaya foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve on the north side of cairn No. 68, passes through it along the north bank of the Paishwani river for seven furlongs and quits it on the north side of cairn No. 57.

X. Path to a portion of Muli warg No. 68 of Mulliar, six feet wide for men and cattle, enters the reserve one hundred yards east of cairn No. 60, passes southward for one and a quarter furlongs and quits it on the north side of the enclosure.

XI. Kolikaya-Mianianga foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve on the north side of cairn No. 84, passes through it along the north bank of the Paishwani river some three furlongs and quits it north-west of cairn No. 83.

XII. Chettetodu-Kolikaya foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve on the north side of cairn No. 87, passes through it eastward for one furlong and quits it on the north side of cairn No. 86.

XIII. Ari-Kuniari foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve on the west side of cairn No. 94, passes through it along the bank of the Paishwani river some three furlongs and quits it on the north side of cairn No. 93; re-entering the reserve on the south side of cairn No. 83, it passes north-east through the reserve one furlong and finally quits it one hundred and ten yards north of cairn No. 77.

XIV. Sanna Kuttinna-Ari foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve on the north side of cairn No. 99, passes south-eastward through it along the bank of the Paishwani river for about one furlong and quits it on the east side of cairn No. 98.

XV. Dadda Kuttinna-Sanna Kuttinna foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve on the north side of cairn No. 103, passes through it south-east along the river bank, about one hundred and ten yards and quits it on the north side of cairn No. 102.

XVI. Tiadka-Dadda Kuttinna foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve at the same point as the Sanna Kuttinna path (P.R.W. No. XVII) below passes through it westward for one furlong and quits it one hundred and ten yards south of cairn No. 106.

XVII. Tiadka-Sanna Kuttinna foot-path to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve fifty yards north of cairn No. 121, passes through it in a generally south-westerly direction for two and a half furlongs and quits it one hundred yards south-west of cairn No. 101.

XVIII. Tiadka-Balebalapu foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve two hundred and fifty yards north-north-east of cairn No. 125, passes through it eastward for one and a half furlongs and quits it twenty yards south-west of cairn No. 89; re-entering the reserve the same distance south-east of that cairn, it passes eastward through the reserve for two furlongs and joins the Puvalamule path (P.R.W. No. XX) at the point at which that path quits the reserve.

XIX. Puvalamule-Padumundakadu foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve on the west side of cairn No. 135, passes through it in a south-easterly direction, about three furlongs and quits it one hundred yards south-west of cairn No. 89.

XX. Puvalamule-Balebalapu foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve fifty yards south-east of cairn No. 138, passes through it in a south-easterly direction for two and a half furlongs and quits it one hundred yards west of cairn No. 75.

XXI. Bepu-Bajr foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve fifty yards south of cairn No. 143, passes through it first north-east and then east-south-east for five furlongs and quits it fifty yards west of cairn No. 3 of the Hiriyannadka enclosure; re-entering the reserve twenty yards north of the same cairn, it passes south-east through it for one and a half furlongs and finally quits it fifty-five yards north-east of cairn No. 43.

XXII. Jadhakemule-Mulliar foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve one hundred and ten yards south-east of cairn No. 148, passes through it in a generally north-north-westerly direction for about four furlongs and quits it one furlong south-east of cairn No. 8.

XXIII. Heggadde-Bepu foot-path, to a width of four feet for men only, enters the reserve one hundred yards north of cairn No. 164 and running east through it for one furlong joins the Tiadka-Mulliar path (P. R. W. No. III).

XXIV. Path from muli warg No. 16 of Mulliar to muli warg No. 37 of the same village to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve two hundred yards west of cairn No. 173, passes through it northward slightly over half a mile crossing the Hiriyannadka bandy-track and quits the reserve two hundred and seventy yards west of cairn No. 8.

XXV. Hiriyannadka-Kudukoli foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve one hundred and fifty yards south of cairn No. 4 of the Hiriyannadka enclosure, passes through it east-south-east for a little over two furlongs and quits it fifty yards north of cairn No. 38.

XVI. Hiriyanadka Kuniari foot-path, to a width of six feet for men and cattle, enters the reserve twenty yards north of cairn No. 3 of the Hiriyanadka enclosure, passes through it in a generally southerly direction for four furlongs and quits it thirty yards east of cairn No. 73.

Gompertz to be the Forest Settlement-officer, who shall enquire into and determine the existence, nature and extent of any right claimed by, or alleged to exist in favour of any person in or over land comprised within such limits, or to any forest produce of such land and to deal with the same as provided in Chapter II of the said Act and the District Forest-officer, Coimbatore, North, for the time being to attend on behalf of Government during the enquiry.

3. His Excellency the Governor in Council is further pleased, under the authority vested in him by section 14 of the said Act, to appoint the Collector of Coimbatore for the time being to be officer of the Revenue Department, who shall hear appeals from the orders of the Forest Settlement-officer under sections 11, 12 and 13 of the said Act.
