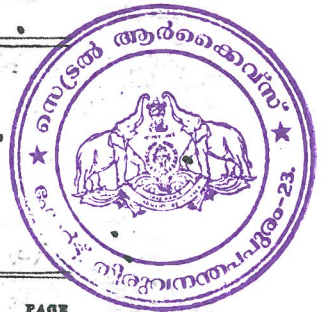

West.—Thence north-north-west two hundred yards to cairn No. 135, north two hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 136 and north-north-east one hundred and fifty-five yards to cairn No. 137 overlooking Maratimale cultivation (mulu warg No. 4 of Delampady village); thence skirting that cultivation, Korakkan darkhast (mulu warg No. 7 of the same village) and mulu wargs Nos. 4, 5 and 6 of that village, north-north-west one hundred and seventy yards to cairn No. 138, north-east the same distance to cairn No. 139, north slightly west sixty-five yards to cairn No. 140, west one hundred yards to cairn No. 141 and north two hundred yards to cairn No. 142; thence passing along the south, east and north sides of Kuthimunda (mulu wargs Nos. 3 and 7 of Delampady village), east-south-east two hundred and forty yards to cairn No. 143, east slightly south two hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 144, east-south-east two hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 145, east one hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 146, north-east two hundred yards to cairn No. 147, north slightly east the same distance to cairn No. 148, west-north-west two hundred and forty-five yards to cairn No. 149, west two hundred and fifty-five yards to cairn No. 150, west-north-west two hundred and ten yards and one hundred and ninety-five yards to cairns Nos. 151 and 152, west slightly north two hundred and eighty-five yards to cairn No. 153, south-west two hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 154 and on slightly more west three hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 155; thence west slightly south two hundred yards to cairn No. 156, north two hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 157 and north-north-east one hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 158 overlooking Waltazy cultivation (mulu warg No. 10 of Delampady village); then passing along the east, north and west sides of the cultivations of mulu warg No. 1 of Kanakamajalu village, (viz., Kauthanamajal, Mogaru Bail and Jalamule), east-north-east three hundred and thirty-five yards to cairn No. 159, north-north-east two hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 160, north-east two hundred and thirty-five yards to cairns Nos. 162 and 163, north slightly east one hundred and thirty-five yards and seventy-five yards to cairn No. 164, north-west two hundred and seventy yards and two hundred and forty yards to cairns Nos. 167 and 168, west slightly north two hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 169, north-west three hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 170, west-north-west three hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 171, south one hundred and seventy yards to cairn No. 174, south-south-west two hundred and fifteen yards to cairn No. 177 and south-south-east one hundred and eighty yards to cairn No. 176, east-south-east one hundred and fifty slightly south one hundred and seventy yards to cairn No. 179, west three hundred and ten yards to cairn No. 180 and on in the same direction two hundred and fifty yards to cairn No. 181 and north-west the same distance to cairn No. 182 overlooking Shantimule darkhast (mulu warg No. 15 of Delampady village); thence passing along the eastern and northern sides of that cultivation, north two hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 183, west slightly north two hundred yards to cairn No. 184 and west two hundred and sixty yards to cairn No. 185; thence north-north-west two hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 186 overlooking Palastadka northern sides of that cultivation, north slightly east two hundred and fifteen yards to cairn No. 187 and west two hundred and twenty yards to cairn No. 188; thence passing along the eastern side of Kamatadka cultivation (mulu warg No. 33 of Mudnur village), north-north-east two hundred and thirty yards to cairn No. 189 the starting point, cairn No. 1.



REMARKS—A. The following enclosure is admitted within the reserve, being itself free from reservation:—
 I. Kasaragod-Jalsur Local fund road, to a width of forty-four yards, i.e., twenty-two yards on either side of a line drawn along the centre thereof. It enters the reserve between cairns Nos. 74 and 75, fifteen yards east of the thirtieth No. 88; again entering the reserve on the east side of cairn No. 87, it runs again south-west about two furlongs and quits it on the north side of cairn No. 78.

B. The following easements will be allowed to be exercised within the reserve:—
 I. Permission is accorded to the cultivator or cultivators, for the time being, of Pujaripalu, Ganigermule, Acharimule and Bagithumaru, all of mulu warg No. 1 of Kanakamajalu village, to construct a dam within the reserve across a stream therein some three hundred and sixty yards north-east of cairn No. 170 of the reserve boundary and to obtain for the construction thereof from unclassified trees within the reserve in the vicinity of the dam two poles, fifteen feet long and six inches thick, twenty-five forked sticks, five feet long and three inches thick and ten head-loads of twigs, also from the bed of the stream, which, for the purpose of this order, will not exceed fifteen feet in breadth, such earth and stones as are required for a dam fifteen feet long, three feet high and three feet thick; also to lead off water from the southern end of the dam in a channel four feet broad, passing generally south-westward through the reserve and quitting it on the

east side of cairn No. 170 of the boundary thereof. Right of entry into the reserve for the construction of the dam and maintenance of the channel will be by the bed of the channel within the limits specified therefor and the maintenance of the channel will be executed with material taken from the bed thereof. This easement will be in force from June yearly for the succeeding five months.

II. Permission is accorded to the District Board Engineer, or such person as may be authorized by him, to issue permits to his road coolies to enter the reserve for collecting metal for the repair of the Mangalore-Mercara road from a quarry situate two hundred yards within the reserve, some two hundred and fifty yards north-west of cairn No. 28 of the reserve boundary. The area of the quarry will not exceed fifty-three yards north to south X ninety-nine yards east to west, the nearest point thereof being two hundred yards west of the road abovementioned.

III. Permission is accorded to the cultivator, for the time being, of Jalamule, a portion of muli warg No. 1 of Kanakamajalu village, to keep in repair, throughout the year, a tank within the reserve situate eighty yards north-west of cairn No. 174; there is no channel from the tank, the water thereof running down a natural ravine to the warg lands at the foot of the hill on which it is located. The size of the tank will not exceed twenty yards X twenty yards and the material for its repair will be obtained from the bed thereof within the limits specified therefor. Right of entry into the reserve for the maintenance of the tank will be by a path, three feet wide for men only, entering the reserve seventy-five yards north of cairn No. 174 and proceeding direct to the tank westward.

IV. Permission is accorded to the cultivator, for the time being, of muli warg No. 6 of Kanakamajalu village to keep in repair the bund of a tank situate within the reserve one hundred and ten yards east of cairn No. 56 of the reserve boundary; the bund will be of earth and stones obtained from the bed of the tank formed, such bed for the purpose of this order not exceeding eighty square yards, viz., ten yards long by eight broad; also to lead off water therefrom by a channel three feet broad, leaving the tank at its north-western corner, passing through the reserve north-westward and quitting it thirty yards north of cairn No. 56. Right of entry into the reserve for the construction of the bund and maintenance of the channel will be by the bed of the channel within the limits specified therefor; the easement will be in force throughout the year.

C. The following public rights of way will be admitted for the use of the public within the reserve :-

I. *Yerakalabail-Mercara ghat road cart-track*, to a width of ten feet, for men, cattle and carts; enters the reserve forty yards north of cairn No. 17, passes east about three-fourth furlong and quits it on the Local fund road from Pattur to Mercara one hundred and thirty yards east of cairn No. 18.

II. *Guddadka-Mogarubail forest road*, to a width of ten feet, for men, cattle and carts; enters the reserve twenty yards south-east of cairn No. 22, runs west about two furlongs and then south-south-west a little over a furlong and quits it on the west side of cairn No. 170.

III. *Nidil-Mogarubail foot-path*, to a width of six feet, for men and cattle; enters the reserve forty-five yards north of cairn No. 36, runs in a west-north-westerly direction about one and-a-half furlongs and quits it on the north side of cairn No. 164.

IV. *Marakonji-Mogarubail foot-path*, to a width of six feet, for men and cattle; enters the reserve ninety yards east of cairn No. 107, runs in a generally northerly direction a little over two furlongs and quits it on the east side of cairn No. 53; again entering the reserve sixty-six yards north of cairn No. 52 it runs west half-a-furlong and quits it on the south side of cairn No. 110; re-entering the reserve on the south side of cairn No. 118 it runs west about a furlong and quits it on the north side of cairn No. 123; entering the reserve once more forty yards west of cairn No. 127, it runs in a north-north-westerly direction about one and-a-half furlongs and quits it on the east side of cairn No. 145; finally entering the reserve seventy yards south-west of cairn No. 163, it runs in a north-westerly direction about one and-a-half furlongs and quits it forty-five yards north-east of cairn No. 169.

2. *Foot-path across the block from one portion of the Kengarai tope to the other, three yards wide and open for people and cattle.*—It enters the block at stone marked 3 on the south side of settlement No. 97 and running south-south-east, leaves it at stone marked 4 on the north side of settlement No. 96-1.
3. *Foot-path from Kengarai to Kengarai tope, three yards wide and open for people and cattle.*—It enters the block 0-27 chain north-east of the south-east corner of settlement No. 78 and running east for 6-41 chains, joins the path in item A-1 supra.

No. 30.—His Excellency the Governor in Council is pleased to notify, under the provisions of section 4 of the Madras Forest Act (V of 1882), that it is proposed to constitute the area, the boundaries of which are described in the schedule appended to this notification a "reserved forest" under the provisions of the said Act.
