The Governor in Council is further pleased, under clause (o) of the said section, to appoint the Revenue Divisional Officer, Trichinopoly, to be Forest Settlement Officer, who shall enquire into and determine the existence, nature, and extent of any rights claimed by, or alleged to exist in favour of, any person in or over any land comprised within such limits, or to any forest produce of such land, and to deal with the same as provided in chapter II of the said Act, and the District Forest Officer, Trichinopoly, for the time being, to attend on behalf of Government at the enquiry prescribed by chapter II.
