Limits of Kannothe reserve forest redefined.

Fort St. George, July 27, 1942.

No. 381.

Whereas the Kannothe and Kannothe Additions I (a), II and III reserved forests have been amalgamated into a single reserved forest known as the Kannothe Reserved Forest;

And whereas the description of the limits of Kannothe reserved forest as amalgamated, is not clear in reference to the existing facts;

Now therefore in exercise of powers conferred by the sub-section (4) of section 17-A of the Madras Forest Act, 1882 (Madras Act V of 1882) and in supersession of the notifications specified below, His Excellency the Governor of Madras is hereby pleased to redefine the limits of Kannothe Reserve forest so as to make the description clear in reference to existing facts by making the following correction to the limits of the said forest.

Revenue Department Notification No. 3, dated 7th January 1919, published at pages 29-30 of Part I of the Fort St. George Gazette, dated 7th January 1919.

Development Department Notification No. 627, dated 27th July 1938, published at pages 1123 to 1125 of Part I of the Fort St. George Gazette, dated 2nd August 1938.

CORRECTION.

For the schedule to the Revenue Department Notification No. 168, dated 14th March 1901, published at pages 525 to 527 of Part I of the Fort St. George Gazette, dated 9th April 1901, the following schedule shall be substituted, namely:—

Schedule.

Malabar district, Kottayam taluk, Chittari paramba, Kannavam, Vekkalam and Kudali amsams, Chittari paramba, Kannavam, Peruva, Edayara, Kolayad, Kommeri, Vekkalam, Puvattur and Pullyod desams. (Name of forest—Kannothe Reserved Forest. Area in acres—20854.72 acres).

BOUNDARIES.

North.—Starting from the easternmost corner of S. No. 127 of Chittariparamba desam, the south side of S. No. 126 and the west side of S. No. 125 of the said desam to the north-west corner of S. No. 22 of Kannavam desam; thence the west sides of S. Nos. 22, 23, 24, 25 and 30 of the said desam (Kannavam) to the north-west corner of S. No. 140 of Puvattur desam; thence the west, south and east sides of S. No. 140 of the same desam to its north-east corner; thence the east sides of S. Nos. 30, 17 and the south side of S. No. 16 of Kannavam desam to the south-west corner of S. No. 1 of Pullyod desam; thence the south side of S. No. 1, west sides of S. Nos. 2 and 4, the west, south and east sides of S. No. 3, the east side of S. No. 4, the south sides of S. Nos. 6 and 11 and west and south sides of S. No. 12, the west side of S. No. 13, the west and south sides of S. No. 19, the south sides of S. Nos. 18 and 17, the south and east sides of S. No. 16, the east, north and west sides of S. No. 15, north side of S. No. 14, and the east side of S. No. 11 (all of Pullyod desam) to the south-east corner of S. No. 45 of Edayara desam; thence the east side of S. No. 45; south sides of S. Nos. 46, 49, 51 and 73 to the southern margin of the Tellicherry-Manantoddy road (at S. No. 62); thence the south margin of the said road (S. Nos. 62 part, 64, 65, 66 and 71 of the abovesaid Edayara desam and S. Nos. 17, 18, 19, 24, 25, 36 and 37 of Kolayad desam) to the north-west corner of S. No. 38 of the same desam; thence its west, south and east sides to its north-east corner on the Tellicherry-Manantoddy road (at S. No. 37); thence the south margin of the said road (S. Nos. 37 and 49) to the north-west corner of S. No. 50; thence its west, south and east sides to its north-east corner on the southern margin of the said road again; thence the said margin of the said road (S. No. 51) to the north-west corner of S. No. 55; thence the west side of S. No. 55; west, south and east sides of S. No. 56 and the south and east sides of S. No. 55 to its north-east corner of the southern margin of the Tellicherry-Manantoddy road (S. No. 54 of Kolayad desam). Thence the south margin of the said road (S. Nos. 48, 49, 50 and 51 of the Puttalam desam) to the north-west corner of S. No. 59 of Kolayad desam; thence the west sides of S. Nos. 59, 60 and 62 of Kolayad desam, the west, south and east sides of S. No. 2 of Peruva desam to the Puttalam desam boundary; thence the south sides of Nos. 60 and 61 of the Puttalam desam; the west, south and east sides of S. No. 1 of Peruva desam to the southern most point of S. No. 69 of Puttalam desam, the trijunction of Puttalam, Kommeri and Peruva desams, thence the east side of S. No. 69, the south and east sides of S. No. 68 of the same desam to the south-west corner of S. No. 15 of Kommeri desam; thence the south-sides of S. Nos. 15, 16, 17, 18, 30, 32 and 30 again, the west and south sides of S. No. 34, the south sides of S. Nos. 33, 40 and 41, the south, east and north sides of S. No. 42, the north side of S. No. 41, again, the east side of S. No. 39, the east and north sides of S. No. 38, the north sides of S. Nos. 36 and 35, the north side of S. No. 30 again (which lies between S. Nos. 35 and 31), the east sides of S. Nos. 31, 30, 29, 25 and 24 of the Kommeri desam to the southern margin of the Tellicherry-Manantoddy road (at S. No. 23 of Kommeri desam). Thence the south margin of the said road (S. No. 23 of Kommeri desam and S. No. 48 of Vekkalam desam) to the north-west corner of S. No. 49 of Vekkalam desam; thence the west, south and east sides of the said S. No. 49 to the southern margin of the Tellicherry-Manantoddy road (at S. No. 49 of Vekkalam desam); thence the said margin of the said road again (S. Nos. 44 and 43 of Vekkalam desam) to the north-west corner of S. No. 50. Thence the west side of that S. No., the west, south and east sides of S. No. 51 to the southern margin of the said Tellicherry-Manantoddy road (at S. No. 54); thence the south margin of the

said road again (S. Nos. 54, 55, 56, 57, 70, 80, 81, 83 and 86 to 100 of Vekkalam desam) to the north-west corner of S. No. 30 of Peruva desam; thence its west, south, and east sides to the south margin of the road again; thence the said margin of the said road (S. No. 100 to 116 of Vekkalam desam) to the south-west corner of S. No. 27 of Peruva desam; thence its south, east and north sides to the said margin of the said road again; thence the said margin of the said road (S. Nos. 117 and 118 of Vekkalam desam) to the south-west corner of S. No. 29 of Peruva desam; thence its south, east and north sides to the said road margin again; thence along the said margin of the said road (S. Nos. 118, 120 to 144 of Vekkalam desam) to the Peria desam boundary of Wynaad taluk.

East.—Thence southwards along the Peria Tondarnad desams to the Kurumbranad taluk boundary.

South.—Thence westwards along the Kurumbranad taluk boundary to the Poyilur desam boundary of the Kottayam taluk; thence along the northern boundaries of Poyilur and Kolavallur desams to the Cheruvancheri desam boundary of the Kottayam taluk.

West.—Thence northwards along the Cheruvancheri desam boundary to the south-west corner of S. No. 62 of Puvattur desam; thence the south and east sides of that number, the south side of S. No. 63; the west sides of S. Nos. 71 and 72; west and south sides of S. Nos. 73 and 74; west, south and east sides of S. No. 75, south and east sides of S. Nos. 76 and 77; the south sides of S. Nos. 130, 133 and 136; west and south sides of S. No. 137, south and east sides of S. No. 138 and the east side of S. No. 126; the south side of S. No. 118, south and east sides of S. No. 117, south, east and north sides of S. No. 114, the east, the north side of S. No. 115; the east side of S. No. 112 and 111, north and west sides of S. No. 113, north sides of S. No. 109, east, east side of S. No. 110, south east and north sides of S. No. 109, east, east side of S. No. 108, the north and the west sides of north and west sides of S. No. 106, north side of S. Nos. 104, 103, 102, S. No. 107, west side of S. No. 106, north side of S. No. 13, south and east sides of S. No. 12, east sides of S. Nos. 11, 10 and 8 (all the above survey numbers referred to are in Puvattur desam); to the south-east corner of S. No. 135 of Chittariparamba desam; thence the east sides of S. Nos. 135, 128 and 127 to the starting point.

The following public rights of way are admitted within this reserve :-

1. A path (for which there is no local name) open to men and cattle 6 feet wide and one mile and one furlong long. It enters the reserve at the south-west corner of S. No. 16 of Kannavam desam and runs generally southwards touching enclosures 2 and 1 and leaves the reserves at the eastern most corner of S. No. 113 of Puvattur desam.

2. A path (for which there is no local name) open to men and cattle, 6 feet wide and half a mile long. It enters the reserve at a point 2 chains north-east of the south-west corner of S. No. 118 of Puvattur desam and runs generally southwards and leaves the reserve at the south-east corner of S. No. 126 of Puvattur desam.

3. A path (for which there is no local name) open to men and cattle, 6 feet wide and one mile and 17 chains long. It enters the reserve at a point 5 chains west of the south-eastern corner of S. No. 138 of Puvattur desam and runs generally south-westwards for 55 chains and leaves the reserve at a point 6 chains north of the easternmost point of S. No. 147 of Puvattur desam. It re-enters the reserve at a point 4 chains south of the north-western point of S. No. 147 of Puvattur desam and runs generally south for 42 chains and leaves the reserve at a point on the northern boundary of Kolavallur desam, 25 chains west of the north-east corner of Kolavallur desam.

4. A path (for which there is no local name) open to men and cattle 6 feet wide and 1/2 mile long. It enters the reserve at the south-west corner of S. No. 28 of Pullyod desam and runs generally southwards touching Enclosure No. 7 (S. No. 29) and leaves the reserve at the north-west corner of S. No. 30 of Pullyod desam (Enclosure No. 8).

5. A path (for which there is no local name) open to men and cattle 6 feet wide and 1/2 mile long. It enters the reserve at the north-east corner of S. No. 30 (Enclosure No. 8) and runs generally eastwards touching Enclosure No. 9 (S. No. 31 of Pullyod desam) and leaves the reserve at a point two chains east of the south-western corner of S. No. 33 of Pullyod desam (Enclosure No. 11).

6. A path (for which there is no local name) open to men and cattle 6 feet wide, and 1/2 mile long. It enters the reserve at a point three chains north-east of the south-west corner of S. No. 33 (Enclosure No. 11) and runs generally westwards and leaves the reserve at the south-east corner of S. No. 29 of Pullyod desam (Enclosure No. 7).

7. A path (for which there is no local name) open to men and cattle 10 yards wide and 14 1/2 chains long. It starts from a point on the right of way No. 6 at a distance of 12 chains west of the point at which right of way No. 6 enters the reserved forest and runs south-westwards and leaves the reserve at the north-western corner of S. No. 32 of Pullyod desam (Enclosure No. 10).

8. A path (for which there is no local name) open to men and cattle 6 feet wide and 3 furlongs long. It enters the reserve at the easternmost corner of S. No. 17 of Pullyod desam and runs generally in an east-south-east direction and enters the Enclosure No. 6 at the south-west corner of S. No. 22 of the same desam.

8A. Kaduvadath Kavu Devaswam path 3 feet wide for men only. It branches from public right of way No. 8 at a point 1 1/2 chains east of its entry into the reserve and runs nearly due north for a distance of 3 1/2 chains to Devaswam enclosure, thence crossing the enclosure it continues in its former direction for a further distance of 3 1/2 chains to the left bank of the tributary to the Edayar stream, north of the enclosure. It is used in connexion with the bringing of water for use in ceremonies at the shrine.

9. Narayanamangala temple (Enclosure No. 4) path, 6 feet wide, open to men and cattle, enters the reserve from the Local Fund road at mile 18, furlong 3 and 3 chains. Thence it passes south to north-west corner of the enclosure, a distance of 6 1/2 chains; thence crossing it, it re-enters the reserve at the south-west corner of the enclosure and continues south-south-east for a distance of 2 and 1/2 miles and enters Enclosure No. 13 at the north-east corner of S. No. 34 of Pullyod desam.

10. A path (for which there is no local name) open to men and cattle 6 feet wide, and 2 1/2 chains long. It branches from right of way No. 9 at a point 1 mile and 14 chains south from its starting point and runs generally eastwards to the south-west corner of S. No. 24 of Pullyod desam.

11. A path (for which there is no local name) open to men and cattle, 6 feet wide and 1/2 mile long. It enters the reserve at a point three chains north of the south-east corner of S. No. 25 of Pullyod desam (Enclosure No. 12) and runs generally eastwards and leaves the reserve at a point one chain north of the south-west corner of S. No. 5 of Peruva desam.

12. A path (for which there is no local name), open to men and cattle, 10 yards wide and 43 chains long. It enters the reserve at the north-east corner of S. No. 14 of Peruva desam and runs in a south-easterly direction for 2 chains and leaves it at the north-west corner of S. No. 15 of the same desam. It enters the reserve again at the northernmost corner of S. No. 15 and runs generally eastwards for 12 chains and leaves it at the westernmost corner of S. No. 21 and runs generally eastwards for 6 chains and leaves it at the south-west corner of S. No. 22. Once more it enters the reserve at a point 3 chains north of the south-east corner of S. No. 22 and runs eastwards for 14 chains and leaves it at a point one chain north of the south-west corner of S. No. 24. Again it enters the reserve at the north-east corner of S. No. 24 and runs eastwards for 9 chains and leaves the corner of S. No. 24 and runs eastwards for the north-western corner of reserve at a point one chain south of the north-western corner of S. No. 25 (Enclosure No. 23). All the above survey numbers referred to are in Peruva desam.

13. Peruva road (cart track) open to men, cattle and carts. It is 10 yards wide and 3 miles 6 furlongs and 5 chains long. It enters the reserve at a point on Tellicherry-Manantoddy road, 4 chains west of the south-east corner of S. No. 71 of Edayara desam and runs generally in a south-easterly direction passing by the sides of Enclosure No. 15 (S. No. 4 of Peruva desam), 14 (S. No. 3 of Peruva desam), 18 (S. No. 16 and 17 of Peruva desam, 14 (S. No. 3 of Peruva desam), 18 (S. Nos. 10 and 17 of Peruva desam) and leaves it at the north-west corner of Enclosure No. 24 (S. No. 26 of Peruva desam).

14. A path (for which there is no local name) open to men and cattle. It is 10 yards wide and 10 chains long. It enters the reserve at the easternmost corner of S. No. 19 of Peruva desam (Enclosure No. 19) and runs generally eastwards for 3 chains and leaves the reserve at the north-west corner of S. No. 23 of Peruva desam. It again re-enters the reserve at the north-east corner of S. No. 23 of Peruva desam and runs in a north-easterly direction for 7 chains and meets the Peruva road (cart-track) right of way No. 13 at a point, 2 furlongs and 2 chains west from the north-west point of S. No. 28 of Peruva desam.

15. A path (for which there is no local name), open to men and cattle. It is 6 feet wide and 1 mile, 6 furlongs, 8 chains long. It enters the reserve at the easternmost corner of S. No. 42 of Kommeri desam and runs in a north-easterly direction for 23 chains and leaves it at the westernmost point of S. No. 75 of Vekkalam desam (Enclosure No. 23). It again enters the reserve at a point, 2 chains south of the northernmost point of S. No. 75 of Vekkalam desam and runs generally eastwards for 6 furlongs and 9 chains and leaves it at the westernmost point of S. No. 77 of Vekkalam desam (Enclosure No. 27). It again enters the reserve at the easternmost corner of S. No. 77 of Vekkalam desam and runs in the same direction for 5 furlongs and 6 chains and leaves the reserve on Tellicherry-Manantoddy road at mile 25 furlong 2 and chain 1.

16. A path (for which there is no local name), open to men and cattle. It is 6 feet wide and 2 miles 5 furlongs, and 4 chains long. It branches off from right of way No. 15, at a point 2 1/2 furlongs west of its exit on the Tellicherry-Manantoddy road and then passing round the contour of the Chakkerikunnu hill in a southerly curve touches the Enclosure No. 23 (S. No. 78 of Vekkalam desam) at its south-east corner and runs along the slopes of Cholli, Vanancheri and Ellarad Hills for a distance of 2 miles and reaches S. No. 28 of Peruva desam (Enclosure No. 25).

Whereas it appears to the Government of Madras that the land specified below is needed for a public purpose, to wit, for construction of an office building and a godown for the Kulittalai Co-operative Urban Bank, notice to that effect is hereby given to all whom it may concern in accordance with the provisions of subsection (1) of section 4 of the Land Acquisition Act I of 1894, as amended by the Land Acquisition (Amendment) Act XXXVIII of 1923; and His Excellency the Governor of Madras hereby authorizes the Sub-Collector, Karur, his staff and workmen to exercise the powers conferred by section 4 (2) of the Act. Under section 3 (c) of the same Act, His Excellency the Governor of Madras appoints the Sub-Collector of Karur to perform the functions of a Collector under section 5-A of the Act.
